How Playing the "God card" allows us to escape responsibility by making a blanket

statement, but it can be a terrible testimony to the world when we use God as a

trump card.

Time Approximately 3-5 minutes

The scene begins with two guys on stage. One should approach the other as though they have casually bumped into each other.

Will: Hey Pete. What's going on?

Pete: *(Glumly)* Nothing.

Will: Hey man. You seem down. Is everything ok?

Pete: I don't know. You know how I've been dating Jennifer for a while?

Will: Yeah.

Pete: Well, things just aren't working out. She's a great girl and all, but I just

don't think I'm into her anymore, but I feel bad about breaking up with

her. I just don't know what to do.

Will: Have you tried the God Card?

Pete: The God Card? What's that?

Will: Think of it as the ultimate Trump Card in life. If you don't want to be

questioned about something, play the God Card and you won't have to

explain yourself.

Pete: Huh. That sounds neat.

Will: Yeah. Just tell Jennifer that God is telling you that you need to be single.

She can't question that, because if she does she'll be questioning God

and no one likes to question God.

Pete: NEATO! The God Card sounds great, but how does it work?

Will: Basically, the God Card is the ultimate justification for any decision you

need to make. It works so well because it implies that God has blessed a

certain decision or situation.
