*Eddie and Tommy talk to audience.*

**Eddie:** We're here to talk to you about something really great! Palm Sunday!

**Tommy:** Yes! This is the time we paint the palms of our hands yellow and wave them in the air to commemorate King Saul talking to that palm reader lady.

**Eddie:** No.

**Tommy:** Yeah.

**Eddie:** No.

**Tommy:** What Bible do you read?

**Eddie:** Palm Sunday commemorates the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. Jesus rode into the city on a donkey, while the crowds spread their cloaks and palm branches on the street shouting, "Hosanna to the son of David!"

**Tommy:** That's what I just said.

*Eddie just stares at Tommy.*

**Tommy:** It's what I meant to say.

**Eddie:** Okay...picture this: Jesus' popularity has gone viral. I mean, he had just raised Lazarus from the dead in this same community just a few days earlier.

**Tommy:** So like the "post-dead" Lazarus was probably at the first Palm Sunday.

**Eddie:** Probably.

**Tommy:** I bet if he was, Lazarus was probably like *(sings Thriller and imitates Michael Jackson)* "this is thriller...thriller Jesus...you raised me from the dead when you said, "Get up! Get up! Get up! Oooh!" *(Eddie gives Tommy a look; Tommy stops.)*

**Eddie:** Now to complete all this, Jesus needed a donkey. But you'd think that a king or a prince would ride in on a horse, but not Jesus. He knew the message he wanted to send. A donkey represents peace. Those who rode on a donkey represented peaceful intentions.

**Tommy:** It says right here, *(looking in his Bible)* Matthew 21, that Jesus asked two disciples to get him a donkey. I wonder which two disciples it was?

**Eddie:** Who knows...maybe Thomas.

**Tommy:** I doubt it. Ah! It was probably Andrew...and...Tony!

**Eddie:** There wasn't a disciple named Tony.

**Tommy:** Sorry. Tony-ius. See why he goes by Tony?
