**What** Here's a support group for people addicted to stuff. This is a great sermon set-

up. Themes: Materialism, Finances, Tithing, Focus, Serving, Fasting, Sacrifice,

Giving

**Who** Moderator

Bill Nancy Ellen

**When** Present

**Wear** 3 chairs

(**Props**) 9-10 cell phones

3 Bluetooth headsets8 sets of car keys2 pairs of sunglasses

\*This is all "stuff" that the characters have in their pocket and purses. It doesn't

have to be exact.

Each character should be dressed nicely or trendy.

**Why** Matt. 6:24

**How** Keep the dialogue very conversational. Don't over-act it, which is sometimes

easy to do when you're playing "characters", or people with exaggerated

personalities. Sometimes the comedy is in your subtleties.

**Time** Approximately 5-7 minutes; This script is 4 pages long.

Three ladies are sitting in a semicircle with an empty chair at the end. The **Moderator** is writing on a clipboard. **Ellen** is furiously texting and periodically laughing. **Nancy** is wearing a Bluetooth® and is busy talking. **Bill** walks from stage left glancing at a business card and seems to be unsure if he's in the right place. **Bill** is dressed in a fancy suit replete with fancy shoes and watch. He's wearing sunglasses, a Bluetooth® ear piece and is holding an iPhone® in one hand.

**Bill:** (Walking to one of the ladies and taking off his sunglasses)

Umm...excuse me. Is this the Consumerism Support Group?

**Nancy:** (*Turning to him*) Hey how are you?

**Bill:** (A little taken aback) Uhh...I'm fine...how are you?

**Nancy:** I'm great, hey...I was thinking that maybe we'd skip church this

Sunday and head to the lake, what do you think?

**Bill:** (Even more surprised) Well, I don't even really know you and besides

after the incident with the duck and the rowboat I don't feel

comfortable...

**Nancy:** (Interrupting) Oh and I'm sorry to hear about your rash...what did the

doctor say?

Bill: (Now turning slightly angry and embarrassed) Who told you about my

rash? Look, it's not my fault I was bitten by a...

**Nancy:** (Reaching to her Blackberry®) Look, I'm going to have to call you back

later, this guy keeps pestering me. (Switching off her headset and

addressing Bill, annoyed) Can I help you?

**Moderator:** (Putting down her clipboard) Okay group, let's get started. Welcome

to the Consumerism Support Group. I know it's Super Bowl Weekend and all of our men seem to have fallen off the wagon. (Noticing Bill)

Well, maybe not all of them. Welcome sir, tell us your name.

Bill: Hi, my name's Bill

The ladies: H, Bill.

**Moderator:** Welcome, we're glad you're here. Let's start by passing around our

Basket of Accountability.

The **Moderator** takes out a basket from under her seat and offers it to **Ellen**. **Ellen** (still texting) glances at the basket and begins texting even more furiously.

**Moderator:** (Softly) Ellen, sweetie, it's time to put it up.

Ellen grits her teeth defiantly and continues texting even more.



**Nancy:** (Touching **Ellen** on the shoulder) Ellen, you have to let it go.

**Ellen:** (Not looking up) But I still haven't checked my Facebook account yet!!!

**Moderator**: Ellen, do you want to be free from your addiction to stuff?

Ellen sighs and reluctantly puts the cell phone in the basket.

Moderator: (Still holding the basket to Ellen) And the other stuff...

**Ellen** takes out her purse and puts in 3 more cell phones, two pairs of sunglasses, a watch and four sets of car keys.

**Moderator:** (Still holding the basket to **Ellen**) How 'bout the Beemer?

**Ellen** reaches into her back pocket and pulls out one more set of keys. She pouts like a child. The **Moderator** offers the basket to **Nancy** who puts in 2 cell phones, her Bluetooth headset and 3 sets of keys. The basket then goes to **Bill** who reluctantly puts his sunglasses, his Bluetooth headset, his car keys and 2 iPhones in.

## **ENDING:**
