never returned home.

R1: May God's word comfort and sustain you.

R2: God's word that says He will never leave us or forsake us. (Deut. 31:6)

And that those who mourn will be comforted. (Matt. 5:4)

C: We remember.

R1: We raise our flags of red, white and blue,

R2: And pledge our allegiance to the colors representing valor,

R1: Innocence and purity,

R2: Perseverance and justice.

R1: We raise our hearts to God in worship

R2: And pledge our allegiance to the Savior who innocently persevered to

the cross and accepted justice on our behalf.

C: We remember.

R1: Thank you to the men and women who gave their lives to protect us.

R2: On this Memorial Day, we honor your bravery, your service and your

love for this great country.

R1: We pray for our nation's future and for those who continue to fight

And we put our hope in the One who has already won the eternal

buttle.

All: We remember.
