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- What** A father talks to his Heavenly Father about what it takes to be a great husband and dad. (Themes: Dads Parenting, Peace, Commitment, Grace, Mercy, Heavenly Father)
- Who** Dad

- When** Present
- Wear (Props)** The setting is in a bedroom, so props or set can be made to look like one or just to imply one. He can be dressed for work or going to church on Sunday morning.
- Why** Ephesians 6:4
- How** The voice of God should be offstage and not “ominous”. In other words, don’t play God as if he were giving Moses the Ten Commandments. Make Him conversational and understanding. The dad should also be very conversational.
- Time** Approximately 2-3 minutes

Dad is in his bedroom getting ready for his day. He could be tying his tie or putting on his shoes.

Dad: God, It's me.

Dad: So, far today I've done alright.

Dad: I'm spending some time this morning talking to you...prayer...that's good stuff.
