How This script should be fun for everyone in the cast. Keep the energy high through

the funny scenes, that way when you turn the corner into the serious moments

they'll have a bigger impact.

NOTE: The Makeup people should be touching up Stacy's makeup; no big

powder puff gags. Also, this would be good right before a talk about the

importance of scripture.

Time Approximately 10-12 minutes

The skit starts with **Stacey** and **Jeff** sitting by one another as if they were in a car.

Jeff: Hey, Stacey, you doin' alright?

Stacey: Yeah, just fine.

Jeff: You sure you don't want anything? Popcorn? Candy?

Stacey: Oh no, I'm just fine.

Jeff: (Very cheesy, yet flirty) Are you sure?

Stacey: (Smiles) Yes, I'm fine.

Jeff: Okay then.

Everything is quiet while they watch the movie.

Jeff: Hey, Stacey...

Stacey: Yes?

Jeff: If you give me a quarter I'll give you a kiss, and if you don't like it I'll give

you a refund.

Stacey: (Laughs) I'm not going to fall for one of your lame pick-up lines, Jeff.

Jeff: Oooh, that hurts. Well, how about this: Let's hop in the back and make

out?

Stacey: Jeff!

Jeff: Oh, c'mon, Stacey. I've never really liked anyone this much before.

Stacey: Really?

Jeff: Yes... really.

Stacey flips a quarter tauntingly at Jeff.

Stacey: Well? What are you waiting for?

Director: CUT! (Enters, frustrated) Stacey, that's not in the script.

Stacey: Um... oh, yeah. I've been meaning to talk to you about that. See, I think

it'll be better if we do it this way. It's what the people want.

Director: But it's not in the script.

Jeff: (Interrupts) If it's any consolation, I kinda like it her way.



Director: Look, it's not in the script. The script written for you doesn't have that

scene in it. Do you understand?

Stacey: Got it.

Director: Stacey, remember this is a movie for teenagers to look at and say, "She's

not afraid to stand up for herself." Okay? Okay. Let's take it from the first

pick-up line.

Director exits. **Assistant** enters with movie clapperboard.

Assistant: Stacey and Jeff at the drive-in, take two. (Clicks the board and exits)

Jeff: Hey, Stacey.

Stacey: Yes?

Jeff: If you give me a quarter I'll give you a kiss, and if you don't like it I'll give

you a refund.

Stacey: (Laughs) I'm not going to fall for one of your lame pick-up lines, Jeff.

Jeff: Oooh that hurts. Well, how about this, let's hop in the back and make-

out?

Stacey: Jeff!

Jeff: Oh c'mon, Stacey. I've never really liked anyone this much before.

Stacey: Really?

Jeff: Honest.

Stacey: I'm really flattered you feel this way, but you've got to give me some

time to let my feelings sort out. Do you understand?

Jeff: Yeah.

Stacey: Hey, cheer up. Let's watch the rest of the movie, okay?

Jeff: Okay.

Jeff puts his arm around **Stacey**. **Director** enters pleased.

Director: And cut. That was great Jeff, thanks. (Jeff exits)

Alright, we're at scene two. (Calls out) Wardrobe and makeup on set! (Wardrobe and Makeup people rush out and add accessories and powder to Stacey before they rush off) Alright places everyone! We're at

scene two: The Slumber Party. (Calls out)



Mandy, Lisa, Terry! On set with Stacey! (Mandy, Lisa, and Terry enter) Now, just relax and pretend you're at a real slumber party.

Director exits. **Assistant** enters with clapperboard.

Assistant: Stacey at Slumber Party, take one. (Clacks board and exits)

Director: (Offstage) And action.

Lisa: What do we do now?

Terry: I know what we can do. Let's play Truth or Dare.

Stacey: Okay. You first.

Terry: Okay. Mandy, I have one for you. Truth or dare?

Mandy: Uh, truth.

Terry: At the Fall Ball, during the last dance, where were you?

Mandy: (Uncomfortable) Well... Jason and I kinda left early.

Everyone: Oooooo.

Lisa: You are so lucky to have Jason.

Terry: Yeah, but I just wish there was a high school version of (hunky actor)

y'know, with that (hunky trait).

Lisa: Okay, Terry. Back to the game. Mandy, it's your turn.

Mandy: Stacey. Truth or dare?

Stacey: Dare?

Mandy: Okay. You have to call Jason, Tim, and the rest of the guys over for a little

"after-hours" party.

Stacey: I can't. My parents...

Terry: They can crawl in the window. No one will see.

Stacey: We're on the second floor!

Lisa: Tim is really tall.

Stacey: (Suddenly fine with it) Okay, fine, they can come over.

Director rushes on to stage.
