- What** A whimsical look at the circus of High School and the pressures students face to give in to pre-marital sex. Themes: True Love Waits, Sex, High School, Peer Pressure
- Who** Ringmaster
Virgin girl
Boy (playing 3 different characters)
- When** Present
- Wear (Props)** Traditional ringmaster costume
Two chairs or a couch
- Why** Ephesians 5:3, 1 Corinthians 6:18, Romans 12:2
- How** This sketch was written for a True Love Waits emphasis to be performed by three people. You may want to break of the **Boy** character into three different guys. If using one actor, use a slight costume change for each scene such as a ball cap or jacket that can be easily put on or off.
- Time** Approximately 3-4 minutes

The **Ringmaster** addresses the audience.

Ringmaster: Ladies and gentlemen! Boys and girls! Welcome to the Public School Circus. A place of amazing feats and strange oddities. You'll see students make straight A's on their test without even studying. You'll watch other students jump through the hoops of peer pressure, and you'll even see relationships tossed high in the air and dropped only to be picked up by another. But first, we want to show you one of the strangest, most unusual human oddities in the world: The Virgin! Watch as she fights off a dangerous attack from a teenage boyfriend.

*Scene One: Characters enter opposite the **Ringmaster** and sit in chairs or a couch.*

Boy: If you love me you will.

Girl: If you love me you wouldn't pressure me to do what I think is wrong.

Boy: Come on. It feels so right.

Girl: The only thing I feel right now is you pressuring me and that doesn't feel right.

Boy: If you won't, I'll find someone else who will.

Girl: Go ahead. And I'll find someone else who won't.

Boy: What are you afraid of? No one will ever know.

ENDING:
