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- What** A Reader’s theater for graduates; Appropriate for Baccalaureate services or other graduation ceremonies. **Themes:** Graduation, Appreciation, Hands and Feet of Christ
- Who** Reader 1

- When** Present
- Wear (Props)** No props are needed, but readers can wear graduation caps and gowns.
- Why** Ephesians 2:10, Isaiah 55:11, Philippians 2:5-8, 2 Timothy 1:7, 1 Peter 2:1-3
- How** Lines from this reader’s theater should be spoken with sincerity using a tempo that flows naturally from one reader to the next. Readers should arrange themselves out of order in a “popcorn” fashion on stage. Instrumental music can accompany the reading.

All Readers enter and address the audience.

Reader 4: The one who explained that impossibly hard math problem.

Reader 5: The one who took me to the store at midnight to get supplies for the project due tomorrow.

Reader 1: Yes, the project that I knew about 2 months ago.

Reader 2: Are you the one who wiped away the tears when I lost my ballgame?

Reader 3: The one who clapped the loudest at my recital?

Reader 4: The one who told me I shouldn't eat all the candy in my bag at once?

Reader 5: And then took care of my bellyache when I did it anyway.

Reader 1: Are you the one who bandaged my boo-boos?

Reader 2: The one who loved me when I was unlovable?

Reader 3: That showed me what Christ's love is really like?

Reader 4: The one who told me about the only One?

Reader 1: The Holy One.

Reader 2: My Savior.

Reader 3: My Hope for the future.

Reader 4: Are you the hands of Christ in my life that held me up when I would have fallen?

Reader 5: Are you the feet that walked with me as I stumbled, learned, and grew?

Reader 1: Are you that one?

Reader 2: Are you the one that taught me the power of self-control and love?

Reader 3: Are you the one that told me I could do anything through the power of Christ?

Reader 4: Are you the one that made me believe that I am God's workmanship?

Reader 5: Made in His image.

Reader 1: Immeasurably loved.

Reader 2: You could be anyone.

Reader 3: My dad or mom.

Reader 4: My grandma or grandpa.

Reader 5: My pastor or Sunday School teacher.

Reader 1: My aunt or uncle.

Reader 2: My bus driver or tutor.

Reader 3: Someone special in my life.

Reader 4: My one.

Reader 5: You know who you are.

Reader 1: And I just want to say thank you.

Reader 2: Thank you for a gift greater than the diploma I will soon accept.

Reader 3: Thank you for being a light in the darkness.

Reader 4: Thank you for the example you set.

Reader 5: Thank you for humbling yourself for my sake and the sake of Christ.

Reader 1: Thank you for being God's hands and feet.

Reader 2: Thank you for being.

All: The one.

Reader 3: And know this.

Reader 4: When I walk across the stage.

Reader 5: You will be walking with me.

Reader 1: Your wisdom,

Reader 2: Your courage,

Reader 3: Your strength,

Reader 4: Your faith,

Reader 5: Are all with me now.

Reader 1: And one day,

Reader 2: Because of you,

Reader 3: I plan to be...
