Time Approximately 4 minutes

Carrie and Melinda address the audience.

Carrie: Happy Thanksgiving!

Melinda: Happy Thanksgiving!

Carrie: You know, it's so easy to be thankful because we've been so blessed. Not

just with "stuff". We've been blessed with the people in our lives and the

freedoms we've been granted.

Melinda: That's right! I'm really grateful!

Melinda leaves the shot. **Carrie** is left there not knowing where **Melinda** went. **Melinda** returns seconds later with a heart-shaped Valentine.

Carrie: Hey. Where'd you go? Why do you have a Valentine's Day card. In

November?

Melinda: Oh. I'm thankful for love. I'm thankful for the people in my life who love

me unconditionally. And I'm thankful for a Savior who loves me. After all,

God is love. Oh! (She's had a thought and leaves again.)

Carrie: (Talking to her as she walks offstage) Okay. That's great. You're thankful

for love.

Melinda comes back with a bouquet of flowers and a cross.

Carrie: Now what?

Melinda: I'm SO thankful that Jesus died on a cross for my sins. And I'm thankful

for spring flowers.

Carrie: Oh. Wait a minute. I think I see what you're doing here. You're not just

thankful at Thanksgiving.

Melinda: That's right! I'm thankful all year round.

Carrie: That's great! Well I'M thankful all year round.

Carrie leaves and returns with a picture of her mom and dad and an American flag.

Carrie: I'm so thankful for my mom and dad and their example to me. And I'm

thankful I live in a country where I'm free.

Melinda: Oh. We're rhyming now.

Carrie: Not on purpose.

Melinda leaves and gets a beach towel, sunglasses and school supplies.



Melinda: Well, I'm thankful for sunshine and swimming pools and air

conditioning.

Carrie: I'm so thankful for our troops overseas who sacrifice so much to defend

our freedoms.

Melinda: I'm thankful that school's started! Yay!!

Their arms are loaded.

Carrie: Well, this is just great. Look how much we have to be thankful for.

Melinda: I know! (Beat) Now what?

Carrie: What do you mean?

Melinda: I mean, it's good we're thankful, but what do we do with it? Is it just

enough to say we're thankful?

Carrie: (Gets an idea) Hey, who did you say your neighbor is?

Melinda: Mr. Hobbs? The one that chases cats with his shop vac?

Carrie: No, not that one. The other one.

Melinda: Oh, Mrs. Jones.

Carrie: This must be a hard time of the year for her, being all alone. I bet she'd

love those flowers. And a visit from you!

Melinda: Oh that's a great idea! And when is the last time you called your mom

and dad, young lady?

Carrie: (Guilty) Probably too long ago. I should call them. And hey, there's tons

of mission projects the church is doing and there are plenty of things to volunteer for in our community that could really make a difference.

That's what Jesus did. He spread His love and served others.

Melinda: Oh, hey, we could write letters or send care packages to our service men

and women.

Carrie: Yep. (*To audience*) Because Thanksgiving is not really about saying

"thanks" once a year. It's about having an attitude of gratitude.

Melinda: That's right. The Bible says in Luke 12:48 "To whom much has been given, much is required." Being grateful should change us from the

inside out. It's not just a word, but a lifestyle. Now take that

thankfulness, get out there and go do something with it! Put some

shoes on your gratitude and take it out for a walk!



Carrie: Yeah! Oh! I'm going to make a pie for my local fire department on

Thanksgiving.

Melinda: Why don't you just wait until they show up to your house...like they did

last year.

Carrie: ("Hurt") That's not funny.

Melinda: (Cheerfully) Happy Thanksgiving!

Melinda elbows Carrie.

Carrie: Happy Thanksgiving!

Optional additional ending.

Carrie: Hey, what's with the clock?

Melinda: Oh, I'm thankful for the extra hour we get in the Fall.

Carrie: You know, we don't actually GET an extra hour. It's just a shift in the time

that-

Melinda: (Very stern) Extra. Hour. Don't take that away from me.
