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- What** Gary and Grady explain what Christmas is all about in this fun comedy duo script perfect for your Christmas Eve service. - Who** Gary  
Grady
- When** Present
- Wear (Props)** No props are needed.  
Grady is the "not-so-bright" one, so he can wear a baseball cap and more casual clothes.  
Gary is dressed a little more nice or smartly.
- Why** Isaiah 9:6; Luke 2
- How** Gary and Grady are written as a comedy duo (think Ocean Spray® guys commercial or Smothers Brothers), so actors need to have a great sense of comic timing. It would also be a great idea to have some music playing in the background- just something light and bouncy to enhance the dialogue.
- Time** Approximately 5-7 minutes

*Gary and Grady address the audience.*

**Gary:** Hello, I'm Gary.

**Grady:** And I'm Grady.

**Gary:** And today we wanted to talk to you about Christmas.

**Grady:** Yes, Christmas was invented by Abraham Lincoln after he defeated all the aliens with Will Smith and Jeff Goldblum.

**Gary:** Oh brother.

**Grady:** What? Was it Lincoln or Ryan Seacrest? I always get them confused.

**Gary:** It was kind of neither. Why don't we take a step back and define Christmas in a larger sense before we discuss the details of it?

**Grady:** Sounds great. I'll take point...

**Gary:** I'm not sure that's such a great idea...

**Grady:** Christmas is a time of year when it's usually cold.

*Extended pause as though Grady assumes he is done.*

**Gary:** Yeah, so maybe we should give them a little more?

**Grady:** *(Struggling to find other elements of the Christmas season. Lots of mumbling and "Uh, ums")*

**Gary:** C'mon you can do it...

**Grady:** There's uh...ummm...there's bells.

**Gary:** Okay...

**Grady:** Yep bells. Lots of bells. Bells everywhere. Just like an insane amount of bells.

**Gary:** Okay, let's not get too hung up on the bells.

**Grady:** They are jingling all the way and they are jingling at you around malls...

**Gary:** Okay but besides the bells, what else...

**Grady:** And when those people with the bells jingle at you outside of malls, you feel guilty because you never have cash, like ever, but that's what they want and they make eye contact with you and jingle their handbell thing really hard, like almost making it an act of aggression and you

make a face like, "I don't have cash!" but you don't actually say that because they probably wouldn't believe you and it makes you consider actually just putting your debit card in there and hoping that they swipe like \$10 and mail it back to you...

**Gary:** Okay, I think we're veering wildly off course.

**Grady:** And then you hand them some coupons from your 5 year-old daughter that promises 5 free hugs just because you feel so bad for not having anything and they look at you like...

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**ENDING:**

**Gary:** What was I saying? Right...because you know what? Christmas is best celebrated when we combine both ideas. When we're letting the awareness of Christ and the meaning of His birth influence us, we're immersing ourselves deeply into the events of the season and investing fully in them instead of being overwhelmed.

It's so easy to be distracted by the small details of the season like it's a jingling bell.

**Grady:** See! I told you. Bells! They are literally everywhere!

**Gary:** But if we're not careful, we'll miss the point of the season and it will just be another thing we experience without truly appreciating it.

**Grady:** Much like Eggnog.

**Gary:** Ugh, Grady...wait...it actually kind of worked that time.
