Themes: Christmas, Truth, Perception, The Word
- Who** Boy
Girl
Narrator
- When** Present
- Wear (Props)** Bible
Dictionary
- Why** 2 Timothy 3:16, Psalm 119:160
- How** It is possible to read this from your script with black binders, but it's best to have the dialogue memorized so that you're talking to the audience and not looking at your script with your head down. Keep the pacing up and watch the rhythm.
- Time** Approximately 5-7 minutes

Boy enters.

Boy: It's all about perspective.

Girl enters.

Girl: It's all about perception.

Boy: Relevance.

Girl: Relatable.

Boy: There is no absolute truth.

Girl: No truth is absolute.

Boy: A person's point of view is their Truth.

Narrator enters and goes to Center Stage.

Narrator: Is it?

Girl: Truth depends on perspective.

Narrator: Does it?

Boy and Girl stand next to each other Stage Right and turn Up Stage. Narrator picks up a dictionary and starts to leaf through it. Narrator finds page and reads.

Narrator: Perspective: Subjective evaluation of relative significance; a point of view.

Girl stands on SR side of the stage and has a sign around her neck that reads, "High School." Boy stands next to her and has a sign around his neck that reads, "Kindergarten."

Girl: *(Upset)* School?

Boy: *(Excited)* School?

Girl: Do I have to go?

Boy: When, when, do I go?!

Girl: I hate school. They always give us homework.

Boy: *(Excited)* We get homework?!

Girl: *(Upset)* Even on the first day.

Boy: *(Excited)* Even on the first day!

Girl: *(Referring to the Kindergartner)* He's got it easy. Kindergarten is *so* easy. All he has for homework is like one page.

Boy: *(Wide eyes)* A *whole* page?

Girl: Just *one* page.

Boy: *(Unbelief)* One *whole* page?

Girl and Boy turn US and take off their signs.

Narrator: Perspective: A mental view or outlook.

Boy and Girl turn DS. This time Girl has a sign around her neck reading, "Girlfriend," and Boy has a sign around his neck reading, "Boyfriend."

Girl: I don't normally like Westerns, but that movie wasn't bad.

Boy: It was okay, I guess.

Girl: The only thing I didn't get was why he died so suddenly.

Boy: Who?

Girl: The main guy. He just fired his gun and then died.

Boy: The gun misfired.

Girl: How did you get that?

Boy: The other guy fixed it so that the gun would misfire.

Girl: What other guy?

Boy: The one in the black hat.

Girl: Oh.

Boy: That was the climax of the whole movie.

Girl: Hmm. Yeah, I guess that makes more sense.

Boy: I thought the weirdest part was when the girl just started bawling.

Girl: At the end?

Boy: Yeah. She just started crying out of nowhere.

Girl: The love of her life just died.

Boy: Who? The main guy? They didn't even talk the whole movie.

Girl: They didn't have to talk. In the beginning, remember, she gave him that hankie.

Boy: Yeah. So?

Girl: So? He wore it in his shirt pocket every time he saw her.

Boy: So?

Girl: It was a symbol of their hidden love.

Boy: How did you get that?

Girl: Were we in the same theater?

Boy: What movie did you see?

Girl and Boy turn US and take off their signs.

Narrator: Perspective: a particular attitude toward or way of regarding something.
