How This script is intended to be performed over Zoom or other video chat platforms. Make sure you speak clearly and that you have a good connection. Give yourself time to create a background setting that looks futuristic.

Time Approximately 3 minutes

Kaitlyn sits at her computer. She squeezes her eyes shut tight.

Kaitlyn: *(addressing Siri)* Hey Siri 3.0, call Sophie and Anna.

Anna and Sophie appear on the screen.

Anna: Kaitlyn, Sophia, Merry Christmas!

Kaitlyn: Merry Christmas to you too, Anna.

Sophie: *(lecturing)* Anna, it's 2999. We're on the verge of a new millennia. I thought this kind of bullying was finally over. You know I don't celebrate Christmas.

Anna: I know. Sorry, I usually celebrate Christmas, but last year I observed a day of silence commemorating the great Squirrel uprising of 2802.

Kaitlyn: I guess someone had to remember the sacrifices those brave squirrels made.

Anna: They were the last living thing to get the right to vote and squirrelism had to come to an end! Even cactuses got the right to vote before squirrels did!

Sophie: Yeah, yeah. Get off your Insta-clean transportation pod.

Kaitlyn: I love Insta-clean. My great-great grandparents had to use soap!

Anna: So, what do you celebrate, Sophia?

Sophie: My favorite invention is body upgrades. I mean, can you believe I'm almost 57?

Kaitlyn: Those are good. I had three arms when I was born.

Anna: My invention of the millennium is chocolate flavored broccoli.
