**When** Present day

**Wear** Gavel (Props) Table

2 chairs

Papers/agenda

**Why** Matthew 7:5, Proverbs 20:19, Romans 12:8, Ephesians 4:32

**How** The dialogue is meant to be humorous in places and comedic timing should be

considered when delivering lines.

**Time** Approximately 5 minutes

**Becky** is seated at the table on stage with the meeting agenda and gavel in front of her. **Kim** enters the stage and pauses after seeing **Becky** seated. She looks perplexed and hesitant as she sits down next to **Becky**.

Becky: Hi Everyone! (Looking across the table as if more people are present; not

acknowledging that **Kim** is the only person at the meeting table) I'd like to call to order the monthly meeting of the Community Unity Society. (Bangs gavel) We will start tonight with our pledge. (Becky stands)

**Kim** is looking around concerned about the lack of members present, but stands and participates with **Becky** during the pledge.

**Both:** On my honor, I pledge to uphold the tenets of the Community Unity

Society. I will avoid competition and invite cooperation. I will

communicate kindly and clearly. I will treat others with love and respect, forgiving and living at peace with others as it is within my power to do

so. (Sitting)

**Becky:** Okay, great! Now, let's get started.

**Kim**: Ummm...Becky, it looks like our membership numbers might be a little

low. Do you think we should talk about—

**Becky**: Kim! Thanks for your input, dear, but we do have an agenda *(pointing to* 

Kim's agenda).

**Kim**: (Carefully to avoid offending) Right, Becky, and thanks for the agenda,

but I'm just thinking that we appear to be the only 2—

**Becky**: (Patronizing) Kim, dear! As I was saying, we have an agenda. If you'll

recall, it's just this kind of disagreement that led us to ask Cindy to leave

our group last month...

**Kim**: (Under her breath) You mean when you asked her to leave.

**Becky**: (Ignoring the comment) Now, as I was saying, the first item on the

agenda is to go over the planning team's idea for the annual fundraiser.

**Kim**: Becky, you and I are the only ones left on the planning team after the

"incident." (Air quotes)

**Becky**: Well, yes. No need to dwell on that, but, as you know, that all started

with Ben and Natalie creating unnecessary conflict.

**Kim**: I think they were just trying to talk with you after you yelled at Mary for

being late to the team meeting.



**Becky**: Kim, dear, our group is about forgiveness and peace. I simply asked

about the planning team fundraiser minutes...?

**Kim**: (Sighing and monotone response) We talked about your idea of a bake

Kim: Right.

**Kim**: That's awful!

**Becky**: I know! How could he complain about us?!

**Kim**: What I meant was that we—

**Becky**: Exactly. So I propose we send him a letter that outlines how to forgive

and forget and how he should adopt a more peaceable attitude.

**Kim**: I'm not sure that will actually help. I mean, don't you think we should try

to offer some kind of help to fix the roses and—

**Becky**: Kim, are you being disagreeable?
