How Low level lighting will need to be used to create the illusion of being in a cave,

but also allowing the skit to be seen. The entire audience gets to be part of the skit. All characters should be over-the-top and full of energy. If you are having

fun with these characters then your kids will have fun too!

Time Approximately 2-3 minutes

The scene opens with **David** running around the audience and talking to the participants as though they are his troops. In the background, **Doeg the Edomite** "**Bounty Hunter**" is watching him. **Doeg** acts as though he is undetectable but he is quite obvious.

David: (Running toward the front of the audience, then stops in the middle of

everyone) All right troops. We can't lose heart now. You have been with me through several battles and we have had victory because of God. When God is on our side, who can be against us? Saul is hot on our trail

but God will guide us.

D's Man: (Comes running into him, sounds winded) David! Saul and his men are

closing in. (He does the air quotes around bounty hunter and says it with a sarcastic tone) Doeg the Edomite "Bounty Hunter" ratted us out.

What are we going to do? How can we hide this entire army?

David: (Looking around the room then points toward the front) Look! A cave.

(Talking to the audience) Everyone, we must enter the cave quickly! (Turn the facility lights off or down to make the darkness of a cave. **David** moves to the front of the room which is now the front of the cave) We will be safe here in the back of the cave but we must be VERY

quiet. (Lowering his tone) Saul and his men are closing in.

Saul: Alright men. Spread out and search the area. David and his army can't

be far. I can almost smell his fear. (Saul sniffs the air around him and has an inquisitive look on his face. He sniffs his armpit. The men with Saul start sniffing the air, then each other and then quietly sniff Saul, look at

each other and then take a step away from Saul.)

Doeg: I'll search the cave.

Saul: No, I'll search the cave.

Doeg: Then I will go with you, Sire.

Saul: No. I must go alone. I have to (looks around then whispers loudly in

Doeg's ear) use the little kings' room.

ENDING:

Saul: (Saul looks down at the ground, rubs his fingertips across his forehead

and then gently shakes his head as though he is coming to his senses. He then looks up and speaks to **David**) Is that your voice, David, my son? (Crying out, remorseful) You are more righteous than I am. You have



treated me with respect but I have treated you badly. I know you will be King. Promise me that you will not kill off my family or wipe out my name from my father's family.

David: I promise.

Saul: Okay, bye. (Saul and his men leave. Looking at the ground,

swords/weapons dragging the ground like they just lost the game.)

David: Come on men. We must continue our journey. We are safe... (dramatic

pause-looking out into the audience) for now.

They all exit a different way than **Saul**. Lights out. The end.
