How Do not rush through the reading, especially if you will be using PowerPoint in

the first section (see directions at the top of page 2). Be sure to put inflection in your reading and make it interesting. It's easy, especially with poetry, to fall into a rhythm. But read it from your heart. These are powerful words with strong

emotions.

Time Approximately 4 minutes

Three O'Clock: An Easter Exploration

If used with a PowerPoint presentation, the underlined words can effectively appear on the screen as they are read. The underlined words are not meant to emphasize when spoken.

One: Three o'clock- <u>Friday afternoon</u>.

Merchants hawk their wares.

Children play in dirty streets.
