How The key to this sketch is not holding back and having fun with it. Another way to

make it a success is to customize it with funny things that are unique to your

ministry, while being careful not to alienate visitors.

Time Approximately 5-7 minutes

Scene One: The sketch opens with very stoic and deadpan narrators that follow each other's lines very closely as if one was speaking.

Narrator 1: In the beginning Adam and Eve...

Narrator 2: ... simply talked to God...

Narrator 1:... and while they could hear him loud and clear...

Narrator 2: ... "Eat whatever you wish of the garden but stay away from that

tree!"

Narrator 1: They... like we...

Narrator 2: ... thought... hmmm...

Narrator 1: ... how could one little apple hurt anyone...

Narrator 2: ... so they both...

Together: ... bit (Both make a "chomping" sound)...

Narrator 1: ... and they got into big trouble...

Narrator 2: ... big, big trouble...

Narrator 1: And now thanks to Adam...(Looking accusingly at Narrator 2)

Narrator 2: ... and to Eve...(Looking equally accusing at Narrator 1)

Narrator 1: ... we have made communication with God...

Together: ... not so easy.

Scene Two: Sandy and Andy close their eyes, hold each other's hand, and stick out their other hand as if they are in a prayer circle with other people.

Andy: (Squeezes her hand)

Sandy: (No response)

Andy: (Squeezes her hand again, harder)

Sandy: (Obviously in pain but still doesn't say anything)

Andy: (Squeezes harder)

Sandy: (Whispering) What are you doing?

Andy: Go.

Sandy: Go where? We're praying.

Andy: I know, it's your turn.

Sandy: But you haven't prayed.

Andy: I know I squeezed your hand. That means I don't have to, so go.

It's your turn.

Sandy: But I don't know what to pray.

Andy: Just say anything. It's your turn.

Sandy: Anything?

Andy: Anything.

Sandy: (Pauses a moment and then confident) I pledge allegiance to the

flag of the United States of America...

Andy: What are you doing?

Sandy: You said say anything...

Andy: Yeah but not that... That's not praying. That's... pledging.

Sandy: Then what do you want me to say?

Andy: I don't know ...pray about your Grandma. Teenagers always pray

about their Grandma.

Sandy: Andy, both my Grandmas are dead...

Andy: Then pray they'll get better.

Sandy: (Elbows Andy)

Andy: I'm sorry, but would you please just go; people are beginning to

peek at us.

Sandy: I don't care. Look, I can peek too. (Opening her eyes, then

mocking them) Look at me. I've got my eyes open during the

prayer.

Andy: Don't do that?

Sandy: Why? Where does it say in the Bible we have to close our eyes

to pray?



Andy: I don't know. I think it's... it's one of the Ten Commandments or

something. Just please close your eyes and pray something.

You're breaking all the prayer rules.

Sandy: (Pauses and then as if she is really about to pray something

"correct") God would you just bless America, land that I love...

(**Andy** nods in agreement)

Sandy: Would you just stand beside her, and guide her...through the

night with the light from above. (Now singing and marching, and dancing with here eyes closed, dragging Andy with her) "God Bless America, my home sweet home!" Amen. (Bows and then

looks up at Andy) How was that?

Scene Three: Narrators return to stage

Narrator 2: As you can see...

Narrator 1: We have made communication with God...

Together: Not so easy.

Scene Four: Franc and Suzette march dramatically to center stage.

Franc: (Dramatically demonstrating) For centuries people have chosen

to simply clasp their hands, bow their heads, and pray to God.

Suzette: (Dancing motions as she speaks) But in today's hard times, we

must learn to fully express ourselves in prayer... through

interpretative dance.

Franc: It is time we get up out of our chairs and move when we talk to

God. (Demonstrates with Tae-Bo and karate moves)

Suzette: It is time for us to say with all that we are. (Waving to God) Good

morning God. Don't be silenced; don't be cast down by tradition,

express yourself to God.

Franc: In other words, it's time to (Dances throughout the rest of his

comment) get jiggy with God.

Scene Five: Narrators return to stage.

Narrator 2: Again as you can see...

Narrator 1: We have made Communication with God...

Together: Not so easy.
