- What** Wyatt and Elroy make an ill-fated trip to Saskatchewan to demonstrate the importance of being connected to a small group. This is a great set-up for promoting small groups! **Themes:** Small Groups, Church, Sunday School, Connecting, Isolation, Outreach, Social Media, Accountability
- Who** Voice Over (VO)
Wyatt

- When** Present
- Wear (Props)** Wyatt and Elroy should be dressed in winter clothes with coats, hats and gloves.
- Why** Romans 12:16; James 4:11
- How** This is a fun and quick way to promote your small groups at your church and the need to connect. Use two actors who can take on the characters of Wyatt and Elroy easily and have fun with them. One of the characters can also easily be changed to a female. - Time** Approximately 3-4 minutes

Elroy and Wyatt enter and stay frozen until the Voice Over is finished.

VO: In the winter of 2008, Elroy Jacobs and his brother-in-law Wyatt entered the icy tundra of Northern Saskatchewan to make a documentary film about social isolation. The team was never heard from again. Later that summer, their footage was discovered by a group of caribou hunters.

What you are about to see is that very same footage.

Lights up.

Elroy: It's a cold world out there, folks. I'm not talking about global warming. I'm talking about the winter of the soul.

Wyatt: I have no idea what you are talking about but it is cold right here. It's cold. IT IS COLD. Right here.

Elroy: And right here, here we are in lovely Northern Saskatchewan.

Wyatt: Also known as winter's bedpan.

Elroy: We're here to experience the world at its coldest. A beautiful metaphor of how we have cut the heart of humanity and all we do is care more about ourselves than anything else and anybody else. Oh yes, my friends, it is cold.
