“Are We His Neighbors?”

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What	A typical “Christian” family passes by 3 scenarios where they could display love to their neighbors, before finding themselves stranded motorists assisted by an unlikely “Good Samaritan.” Themes: Hypocrisy, Service, Giving, Compassion, Christ-like
Who	Mom Dad Kid #1 – younger (boy or girl) Kid #2 – older (boy or girl)
When	Present
Wear (Props)	At least 4 chairs Recorded radio spot Car noise sound effect Motorcycle sound effect
Why	Luke 10:25-37
How	This script will take some rehearsal time to get the timing down with the sound effects. The actors playing the children should be very comfortable on stage and taught to avoid their natural instincts, like looking at the audience and laughing when the audience does. The more practice time you have, the more comfortable they will be.
Time	Approximately 3-4 minutes long; This script is 3 pages long.

Mom, Dad, & kids load into the mini-van after church — chairs lined up at a slight angle so everyone can be seen — actors "act out" the bumps & turns.

Dad: Everybody in! *(Ushers the kids into the van while waving at the pastor)*
Bye Pastor Jerry! See you at the elders' meeting on Wednesday.
Everybody wave!

Kids: Bye Pastor Jerry!!!

Everybody buckles in and gets settled.

Mom: So did anything exciting happen this morning?

Kid #1: I got candy from Mr. Otis!

Kid #2: Me, too . . . except I got more.

Kid #1: Did not.

Kid #2: Did, too.

Kid #1: Did not.

Kid #2: Did, too

Dad: Enough! If I have to come back there . . .

Mom: What did you learn in your class today?

Kid #1: We learned about the Purple Good Smart Man. *(Slurred together to sound like a mispronunciation of "Parable Good Samaritan")*

Kid #2: What? Nuh, uh. We learned about the Parable of the Good Samaritan, stupid.

Dad: Hey, I will stop this car.

Kid #2: Sorry.

Kid #1: Mommy?

Mom: Yes, honey.

Kid #1: Trevor said that his daddy went away and now he and his mommy are going to have to live somewhere else.

Kid #2: Yeah, he said that his dad would get really mad and yell a lot and sometimes break stuff. He said that he took a lot of their money and that's why they have to move.

Kid #1: Maybe, they could come live at our house!

Kid #2: Yeah! Like a big sleepover!

Mom: I don't think so, sweetheart. *(Leans over to her husband so kids don't hear)* Everybody told her not to get involved with him and she wouldn't listen. It's such a shame for Trevor but it's not like she didn't know better.

Kid #2: Check out those tattoos!!!

Kid #1: Mommy, he has more earrings than you do!

Kid #2: Can I cut my hair like that?

Mom: Not if you want to live under our roof!

Kid #1: Was he born with it that color?

Kid #2: Of course, not, dummy.

Mom: Don't start that now. Here comes your dad.

Dad: *(Gets back in the car)* He made a call for us on his cell phone and he's just going to wait until someone comes.

Kid #1: Dad?

Dad: What is it now?

Kid #1: Are we his neighbors?
