- What** Starting a new year can be daunting, but God has promised us that He will stand by us and never leave us. He has given us what we need to stand strong and walk daily with Him. This script is perfect for your worship time in your youth group or main church worship.
Themes: Back to School, New Years, Faith, Courage
- Who** Reader 1
Reader 2
Reader 3
Congregation
- When** Present
- Wear (Props)** 3 Black Binders for Readers
- Why** Ecclesiastes 7:20; 1 Samuel 16:7; 2 Timothy 1:7;
- How** The dialogue should feel as if one person is reading. Keep the pace steady and make sure that you don't read too fast or too slow. Be sure to lead the congregation with their lines. If you have a screen available, display the lines on the screen so that the congregation can read along with you. If not, you can provide a printed script for them.
- Time** Approximately 1-3 minutes

Readers 1,2, and 3 address the audience.

- R1: Every year I try.
- R2: Try to start the year differently.
- R3: And every year seems to end up the same.
- R1, R2, R3: Because I feel so alone.
- R1: So alone and so different because of my Faith.
- R2: I want you to keep reminding me, Jesus -
- R3: That I am not alone.
- R1, R2, R3, C: Jesus, You stand with me.
- R1: You stand with me as I try not to obsess about my outward appearance.
- R2: "People look on the outward appearance but the Lord looks at the heart." (1 Samuel 16:7)
- C: **Jesus, you stand with me.**
- R3: You stand with me when I fear that my heart might be rejected.
- R1: "God deserves praise, for He did not reject my prayer or abandon His love for me." (Psalm 66:20)
- C: **Jesus, You stand with me.**
- R2: You stand with me when fear drives me toward feelings of failure.
- R3: "For God did not give us a spirit of fear but of power and love and self-control." (2 Timothy 1:7)
- C: **Jesus, You stand with me.**
- R1: You stand with me when I start to wonder about my purpose and my future.
- R2: "For I know what I have planned for you says the Lord. I have plans to prosper you, not to harm you. I have plans to give you a future filled with hope." (Jeremiah 29:11)

ENDING:

R3: "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever!" (Hebrews 13:8)

R1: And I know this year can be different.
