Why Genesis 37-47

How This script is all about story-telling and allows for a lot of silliness. You can add

modified to use for children's ministry.

Time Approximately 8-10 minutes

Tommy and **Eddie** address the audience.

Tommy: There are so many great stories in the Bible and a sad truth is that there

are a lot of people who don't know those stories. Let's see there's

Abraham, there's Noah, there's Isaac, and Jacob...

Eddie: There's Joseph.

Tommy: Oh, I hadn't gotten that far yet.

Eddie: Oh, well, that would be a good story. Why don't we tell the story of

Joseph?

Tommy: Oh. Okay. Well, it won't take long because we don't know that much

about Joseph. He was a carpenter, we know that...

Eddie: No, no, no, the other Joseph.

Tommy: There's another Joseph?

Eddie: Yeah, in the Old Testament.

Tommy: There's another Testament?

Eddie: Let's just tell the story of Joseph, because there's a great illustration

there of how God is in control.

Tommy: Okay, Jacob had twelve sons and his favorite was Joseph.

Eddie: Yes, and Jacob loved Joseph so much that he made him this beautiful

coat. Now I'm not talking just any kind of coat, it was a Technicolor coat.

It was truly amazing.

Tommy: Call it what it was, it was a rainbow coat. Can you imagine a dad giving a

son a rainbow coat?

Eddie becomes the Dad and picks up the colorful coat and shows **Tommy**. **Tommy** becomes Joseph, the Son.

Eddie: Hey, Son, look at what I got you here! Look at this!

Tommy: Hey, Dad, how are you?

Eddie: I'm good. Did you know you're my favorite?

Tommy: Yeah, Dad, I did. How's your limp?

Eddie: It's good.

Tommy: How'd you say you got that again?



Eddie: Old wrestling wound. Hey, I made you this coat. You like it?

Tommy: (Looks it over with skepticism) Are you sure you didn't make that for

Mom?

Eddie: I made it for you. It's a rainbow coat. I couldn't pick just one color.

Tommy: You could have. You could have picked one color. You know what? That's

fine. Thanks, Dad!

Eddie: No, no, put it on!

Tommy: I'd rather not.

Eddie: I need you to put it on. Come on, come on, you're my favorite!

Tommy: (Puts the coat on) Oh, this is awkward.

Eddie: What do you think?

Tommy: Well, it seems like a Care Bear® threw up on it.

Eddie: It's beautiful! You're my favorite!

Tommy: Thanks, Dad.

Eddie: Those colors are so beautiful! Back in my day if we wanted to see colors

like that we'd have to smash our heads against the wall over and over.

Tommy: That's funny, I want to smash my head against the wall right now.

Eddie: Hey, do your brothers know that you're my favorite?

Tommy: I think it's understood.

Eddie: I'll tell them right now. (Shouting) He's my favorite!

Tommy: (*To the audience*) And he was his favorite. Actually, Joseph started

getting in on the same thing. Not only would he brag about how he was his father's favorite, but he started telling them about the weird dreams he was having. (*Tommy becomes Joseph and Eddie becomes one of his*

brothers) Hey, Simeon.

Eddie: Hey, Bro, what's up?

Tommy: Nothing. Just wearin' my coat!

Eddie: Hey, I didn't want to tell you this, but people around town are kind of

making fun of you and talking about your coat.



Tommy: Jealous?

Eddie: No, I don't think I'm jealous. It's a rainbow coat, dude.

Tommy: And it's awesome. And do you know why I have a rainbow coat?

(Mockingly) I'm Daddy's favorite!

ENDING:

Eddie: And right then before their very eyes, they saw their brother, Joseph.

And what did Joseph do?

Tommy: He killed them! He slayed them all! He laid them all out and destroyed

his evil brothers! And he brought about his evil revenge! And the moral of the story, children, is revenge works! Destroy anyone who has ever hurt you before! Take them outside and destroy them! Go now! Find

them! Kill them!

Eddie: No! No, no, no! That's not the moral of the story! The moral of the story is

that Joseph showed forgiveness for his brothers. And every time that we see a dead end, it's only deliverance for God's vision. For God's purpose.

Tommy: It's not always about us or what we planned. It's about God's timing and

what He has planned.
