Congregation: Lord, we invite you to our table.

**Reader 2:** The table where we share stories

**Reader 2:** in remembrance of all we hold precious,

Congregation: Lord, we invite you to our table.

Reader 1: We open our table to you, Lord,

**Reader 2:** and to those who are in need

**Reader 3:** may we be Your hands to the lonely and to the poor

Reader 1: Reaching out to extend the favor you have shown us (Prov. 19:17)

Congregation: Lord, you have given us so much.

**Reader 2:** May we share the blessings You have so richly given us,

**Reader 3:** blessings that we have not earned

**Reader 1:** yet You have poured out endlessly upon us.

**Reader 2:** For we know all things good and perfect come from above.

Congregation: Lord, we thank you for your blessings.

**Reader 3:** And thank you, Father, for the blessing of your Son,

**Reader 1:** for in His sacrifice

**Reader 2:** we will never hunger

**Reader 3:** and we will never thirst.

Congregation: For You are the living bread that came down from heaven. If

anyone eats from this bread he will live forever. (John 6:51)
