How This sketch was used to introduce a message on the omnipotence of God. It

raises questions about God's nature, but at the same time illustrates how we often have questions beyond what we need to know. The sketch looks like a bad anti-drug skit at first, but quickly descends into the absurd to illustrate our innate demand for answers and the fact that some things we just aren't meant

to fully know and understand.

Time Approximately 4-6 minutes

Three high school kids, **Gertrude**, **Ethyl**, and **Harold**, stand stage left in light-hearted conversation. A surly looking man approaches them with the airs of a drug dealer. He is shifty and overcautious.

Dealer: Psst. (*They don't respond*) Psst. (*Nothing*) Hey you three! Come over

here.

Gertrude: Who? Us?

Dealer: Yeah, you. Come over here.

They join him center stage.

Ethyl: Who are you?

Dealer: Doesn't matter. I got something for ya.

Harold: Um...what do you mean?

Dealer: You three like to have a little fun, right?

Ethyl: I guess so.

Dealer: Well I got something you're gonna love. I've got just the thing you've

been looking for.

Gertrude: What have we been looking for?

Dealer: Answers, my friend. Answers.

Harold: Answers to what?

Dealer: Questions! What else? (*To Harold*) You're not too bright, are ya kid?

Gertrude: You want to give us answers to our questions?

Dealer: Not me, kid. This!

He holds up a magic eight ball.

Ethyl: What's that?

Dealer: It's what you've been seeking: Answers to all of life's questions.

Harold: Oooooh. It's so mysterious.

Gertrude: It's a magic eight ball.

Dealer: It gives you answers.



Gertrude: Are they informed answers?

Dealer: They're answers. Wanna try?

Harold: Oooh, me first! (Takes eight ball) What do I do?

Dealer: Ask it a question, shake it, and then turn it upside down. You'll have

your answer.

Harold: I can ask it anything I want?

Dealer: Anything at all.

Gertrude: This is stupid.

Harold: Um. Will the Giants (or whichever team) win the Super Bowl?

Shakes it, turns it over.

Ethyl: What's it say?

Harold: "My sources say no." Dang it.
