Why Matthew 1:18-25

How Keep the dialogue conversational and be careful not to overact.

Time Approximately 4 minutes

Mary sitting, Joe standing off to the side, somewhat irritated.

Joe: (Deep breath) Have you told your parents yet?

Mary: No.

Joe: How long have you known?

Mary: Not long. I wanted to talk to you first.

Joe: What do you think they'll do?

Mary: What do <u>you</u> think they'll do?

Joe: And you're sure?

Mary: Yes.

Joe: You're positive – there's no mistake.

Mary: I'm positive.

Joe: (Pause) I just can't believe this is happening.

Mary: I know.

Joe: Not...us.

Mary: What do you mean?

Joe: I mean, things like this don't happen to couples like us. We're supposed

to be one of the "good" ones. (Pause) No one would ever think we'd find

ourselves in a situation like this.

Mary: Is that what you call this? A "situation"?

Joe: Come on. You know what I mean. I just don't think I'm ready for this.

Mary: And you think I am?

Joe: Well, you sure don't seem very upset about it.

Mary: I was. But that's why I came to you. So that we could figure out how to

deal with this together -- the two of us

Joe: Us. Do you have any idea what this does -- to us?

Mary: (Slightly irritated) Yes – I do.

Joe: I mean, this changes – everything.

Mary: I would hope it changes – nothing!

Joe: How can you say that?

Mary: Look. I know that having a baby is not the kind of thing we were

planning on. At least not now. But we are. And it scares me to death. I have no idea what other people will say, or think, or do. But there is no doubt in my heart that this is the right thing to do – no matter what

happens next.

Joe: I don't know. We had a plan, you and I. I was going to work for my dad,

develop skills, build a bank account, get a home and then we would get

married. And later – kids would come.

Mary: That's still a wonderful plan. We just change the order a little. As long as
