How Take your time with this as Vinny has a lot of ideas and emotions to process as

he talks conversationally about the state of the temple.

Time Approximately 2-3 minutes

A construction worker enters with tool belt and safety glasses on. He sets a toolbox down. He removes his work gloves.

Vinny: Well, that oughta do it. Looks like—

Oh, I'm sorry. I thought you were the owner. Whaddya stop by for? Take a peek at the place?

He looks around.

Pretty nice house, huh? Yeah, nicest one in all of Jerusalem, if you ask me. That is, nicest of any house that don't have the name Zerubbabel on the mailbox.

But uh...we've done a lot of work here. Tile floors last summer. Put in the pool the year before that. Just got done with these carved wall panels. Nice panels. I mean you gotta be pretty into paneled walls, but if that's your thing, this is some nice paneling, let me tell you.

Gazes into the distance at the temple.
