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"Now Auditioning for 2021:Female Version"

What

Dissatisfied with how the year 2020 turned out, two people "audition" scenarios for the new year, 2021. This lighthearted but poignant script will encourage audiences to consider God's role in their new year. Options include a male or female version of the script.

Themes: New Year, New Beginnings, Faithfulness of God, Covid

Who

Woman 1 Woman 2

When

New Year's, 2021

Wear

Modern clothing,

(Props)

3 sheets of foam board

On one piece of foam board, write "Option 1: Perfect Hair. Perfect Family. No Sickness. Perfect Marriage. Perfect Job. No Troubles."

On second, write "Option 2: Quarantine. Toilet Paper Shortage. Masks and Gloves."

On the third, write "Option 3: God".

Why

Isaiah 40:31, Romans 8:18

How

This skit can take place in any "setting". The women are obviously friends and talk easily with one another. They can laugh together and be sad together, but their conversation is ultimately to provoke thoughtfulness at God's involvement in the New Year. Place the sheets of foam board so the audience can see only the backs of them, the blank side. Actresses will be facing the audience while looking at the foam board. After Woman 1 reads them in the script, she should place each one so they are facing the audience.

Time

Approximately 3-4 minutes

Woman 2 is standing onstage, looking thoughtfully at foam board signs. **Woman 1** enters and approaches **Woman 2**.

Woman 1: (excitedly) Hey!! (Hugs **Woman 2**) It's so good to see you! (Looks around and notices foam board signs) What are you doing?

Woman 2: I'm auditioning years.

Woman 1: Auditioning years?

Woman 2: Yeah.

Woman 2:

Woman 1: I have no idea what that means.

Woman 2: Well, let's be honest, 2020 was pretty awful. I mean, when people run out of toilet paper, things get ugly. So, I decided I didn't want to do another year like that, hence the auditions!

Woman 1: (nodding, as if she gets it) Oh! (Quickly changing to confused look) I still have no idea what that means.

Woman 2: I have 3 options, see? (Points out Options 1-3)

Woman 1: (picks up Option 1 sign and reads out loud) Option 1: Perfect Hair. Perfect Family. No Sickness. Perfect Marriage. Perfect Job. No Troubles. Wow. (Looks at Woman 2) That sounds like, well, like the perfect year! You should absolutely take that one!

Woman 1 sets foam board down but positions it so the audience can now see the words.

Woman 2: Yeah, I've been sitting here thinking about it. I'm really tempted by that one! Buuuut...

Woman 1: But what? It's perfect! Why wouldn't you want that?

That's just it. What if I DID have the perfect year? It sounds like I'd be happy but would I really? I was just looking back at my life and thinking about the time I mixed up my allergy pills with the dog's flea medication. The dog slept all day and my scalp stopped itching. (Both women smile) Then there's the video of my daughter's first Christmas. We were showing her the tree for the first time but instead of being mesmerized, she threw up all over it. (Laughing) And the time I decided I'd had enough of the gray streaks in my hair so I googled home remedies and it recommended soaking my hair in brewed tea. Except I didn't have any tea, so I used coffee. My hair was still gray AND I smelled like a coffee shop for 3 weeks. (Both women laughing by now) If I had a perfect year where nothing went wrong, what would we laugh about at our family gatherings???

Woman 1: Good point. I never thought of it that way. Okay, well then what about Option 2... (Picks up Option 2 sign and reads out loud)
Option 2: Quarantine, Toilet Paper Shortage, Masks, and Gloves...
Whoa, Whoa, Whoa! That sounds like a repeat of 2020!

Woman 2: I know. I thought about lighting that one on fire but figured it would probably start Armageddon or something.

Woman 1 laughs and sets foam board down but positions it so the audience can now see the words.

Woman 2: But to be honest, I actually can't just cast that one off.

Woman 1: Are you kidding me? I thought that was the point of these auditions?? Last year was awful, remember? Why would you WANT that? Why would anyone WANT that?

Woman 2: I don't WANT it. No one WANTS it. And I would never make light of the suffering that happened in 2020. (Pause, then continue sadly) I lost a friend to COVID. People around the world are still hurting from the entire experience. (Mood changes to determined, passionate)

But I can't just throw it out completely...because God used it. All of it. He brought church services into homes of people who would never set foot in a church building. He turned our hearts to the really important things in life like family, friends, loving one another, and sharing the love of Christ. He showed ME that MY priorities were a mess. (Slowly) I don't know, in all the pain, there were also just a lot of "God Moments".

Woman 1: (thoughtfully) Yeah. I guess I saw that too. (Pause) Well, what's option 3? (Picks up Option 3 sign) Wait...this one just says, "God".

Woman 2: I know.

Woman 2:

Woman 1: *(incredulously)* You're auditioning God? *(Pause)* Uhm...I'm pretty sure if He doesn't make the cut, it's your fault.

Woman 2: (laughs) Yeah. You know, I've been sitting here staring at that one for a long time.

Woman 1: I don't really understand. What does a year look like that just says "God", with no description?

(good naturedly exasperated at not knowing) I don't know! Perfect Family or Relationship Struggles? Perfect Job or No Job? Perfect Health or Virus? Perfect Hair or Coffee-Infused Hair? I don't know! From that card, all I know is that no matter what happens, God will be with me in it. No guarantee on what happens, just the guarantee that I won't be alone through it.

Woman 1: (looking at Woman 2) Wow. I guess the choice is harder than I

thought. What will you choose?

Woman 2: (turning to the audience) What will YOU choose?
