- When** Present
- Wear** None
(Props)
- Why** 1 Timothy 5:17
- How** Keep the dialogue conversational, but stay on top of your queues. Don't rush your lines, but keep the pacing and energy high. Think "Who's on First".
- Time** Approximately 4 minutes

Sam and Ralph enter opposite sides of the stage.

Sam: Good morning, Ralph.

Ralph: Morning, Sam. How are you?

Sam: Fine. Actually much better than fine. I just left another great day of worship at *(your church's name)*.

Ralph: You really love that church don't you?

Sam: I do. I do. It is such a wonderful experience every Sunday. With the preaching, the teaching, the music, it all creates a great environment for worship. I'm growing closer to the Lord and my fellow churchgoers every week.

Ralph: That's really nice for you, but what makes it so great. The pastor?

Sam: The pastor is fantastic, but the entire staff is Fantastic, Wonderful, Amazing, Cool, and...

Ralph: I'm sure everyone thinks that about their staff.

Sam: I don't think that about my staff. That is my staff.

Ralph: What do you mean that is your staff? Let's start with the pastor.

Sam: Fantastic.

Ralph: I'm glad that makes you happy. Now, what do you call your pastor?

Sam: Fantastic.

Ralph: No, no, I mean when what's his name?

Sam: Fantastic.

Ralph: Let's try this in a different way. Does your church record your pastor's sermons?

Sam: Of course, we do.

Ralph: And after they are recorded are they made available on the internet?

Sam: Obviously.

Ralph: So, if I were to go to an internet location that would allow me to listen to you pastor's sermons, I would search for?

Sam: Fantastic sermons.

Ralph: That's where I would find his sermons.

Sam: Yes.
