How This should start out with a lighthearted and fun feel. The group has just come

out of a haunted house, so they should begin with that excited energy to really give the audience a feel for where they've just been- nervous laughter, out of breath, etc. Once they get to the heart of the script, things take a little more serious turn (we call it "the dip"). It quickly picks back up with an upbeat ending.

Time Approximately 6 minutes

The lights are dimmed so the stage has an eerie feel. Suddenly, Jay, Micky, Lisa, Melanie, Todd, and Nick come running on stage, all of them but Nick screaming hysterically. They are dressed in different costumes. Lisa is dressed as a cheerleader, Micky is a ghost. Jay, Melanie, Todd can be whatever. Nick is not in costume.

Jay: That's the doggone scariest thing I've ever experienced in my life.

Micky: (Scaring the group) Ahhh!

Everyone except **Nick** screams. **Nick** just rolls his eyes. **Lisa**, extremely hyper, is doing cheerleading jumps all over the stage.

Nick: Come on you guys. You're being ridiculous.

Todd: Oh, right, Nick. Like you weren't scared to death in there.

Nick: No, I was not scared. You want to know what scares me? That. (Points to

Lisa jumping all over the stage.)

Lisa: GO TEAM!

Micky: Boo!

They all scream, except, of course, Nick.

Nick: Would you stop that, Micky!

Micky: What? I didn't do anything.

Melanie: That wasn't you? Who was it then? I'm scared!

Jay: I'm not so sure we should've gone through that haunted house, guys.

My knees are still shaking.

Nick: I can't believe I wasted twenty-five bucks on that bunch of hype.

Jay: That stuff is real, Nick.

Nick: Oooo, ghosts and goblins. I'm soooo scared. Give me a break.

Lisa: (Finally coming over, out of breath) Hi guys. Don't you just love

Halloween?

ay: Not particularly.

Lisa: What are you talking about? It's the one time a year that you get to be

something that you aren't! Like me! A cheerleader! (Does a quick cheer

and a kick) And Micky, he's a fabulous ghost, don't you think?

Nick: Micky, how much did you pay for that costume, anyway?

Micky: I'll have you know I got this at one of the top costume shops in town.

(Nick laughs at him) What?

Nick: How much?

Micky: Fifty dollars. It was on sale, half off.

Nick: Micky! This is a sheet with holes cut in it!

Micky: No it's not! It's a ghost costume! The guy told me it was used in the

Broadway show "Phantom of the Opera". (Everyone is staring at him) What? Hello? The phantom! (Motions up and down at his costume.)

Melanie: I'm afraid you got ripped off, Micky.

Nick: THERE'S the real evil in this world! People like that who take advantage

of idiots like Micky.

Lisa: What'd you dress up as this year, Nick?

Nick: *Nothing.* Costumes are stupid.

Lisa: Oh really? Because I was certain you came as a jerk.

Nick: Very funny. Look, I'm just saying that all this hoopla over haunted

houses and eerie sounds and witches and ghouls is just ridiculous. I don't know what you all are so scared about. It's a bunch of nonsense.

There is no such thing as EVIL.

Lisa: (Very serious) Are you kidding me? You don't think there's a spirit realm,

and at that, an evil spirit realm?

Nick: No I do not. I think people imagine all these evil things so they can have

an excuse to be horrible.

Todd: What's your excuse?

Jay: Guys? I'm getting the creeps. I think we should get out of here.

Nick: Jay! Those are make-believe monsters in there! Fake blood! Plastic fangs.

Make-up and costumes!

Jay:

Fine. Maybe that was fake, but I know there is real evil in the world. (Looks around) Did you hear that?

Melanie: Micky. (Hitting him)

Micky: Uh, that wasn't me.

Jay: It sounded like a zombie.

Nick: I can't believe you talked me into going to this stupid haunted house

when I could be at home, in my nice, warm bed, eating candy and

watching Jimmy Fallon.

Micky: Colbert's better.

Nick: I'm leaving!

Nick goes around to everyone and takes their sacks of candy away.

Todd: Nick, what are you doing?

Nick: You know what? I forgot. I did dress up for Halloween. JUST CALL ME

SCROOGE!

Nick stomps off.

Lisa: (Sighing) Maybe coming to this haunted house wasn't such a great idea.

I thought it would be fun, but it's not that fun, is it?

Jay: Well, unless you consider the hairs on the back of your neck standing

straight up fun, I'd have to say I'm not having that much fun. Did you

hear that?

Micky: I can understand why Nick is confused. I mean, we've commercialized

evil. And the truth is, the evil in this world is much scarier than a haunted house could ever be. If Nick thinks evil is ghosts and goblins,

no wonder he doesn't believe it.

Lisa: But isn't there such a thing as ghosts? Evil spirits? I mean, I kind of

believe in that stuff. Don't you guys?

Todd: I don't know. I thinks sometimes it's human nature that's evil, that we

blame the "devil" a little too much.

Micky: But I definitely think there's something out there, getting people to do

the horrible things they do.





It's all pretty confusing. I mean, witches, satanists, devils, ghosts. People shooting each other in the streets, killing children. (She gets very somber) I guess one thing we can be sure of. There is evil in the world.

They get quiet.

Melanie: I guess it was pretty stupid for us to come out on Halloween night and

join in everyone's fascination with evil, huh?

Lisa: Probably not the best decision we could've made. I guess we should go

find Nick, see if he's okay. Maybe we could grab him and go to church. I

hear they're having a Fall Carnival or something.

Todd: I think that would be a much more productive use of our time.

Lisa: ALRIGHT! LET'S GO! LET'S DO IT! (She starts jumping around like a

cheerleader again.)

Micky: Hey guys? What's the real "Phantom of the Opera" costume look like?

Lisa: It's a mask, Mickey. And it only covers half of your face.

Micky: I got a much better bargain with my costume, then. It covers my entire

body! (They all shake their heads and begin to walk off) What? What? Hey

guys?

Lights fade.
