When 50 years after Steve and Jennifer's wedding (as seen in "I Do part 1")

Wear A cross-stitched picture

(**Props**) A roll of toilet paper with words scribbled on it

Music-Wedding March

Why 1 Corinthians 13, Proverbs 30:18-19; Ephesians 5:21-28

How This sketch works best if it follows "I Do – Part I". Use each sketch at different

ends of the programs or as a follow-up sketch the next week. Use the

beginning of the sketch for humor, but do not be afraid to be loving and tender

towards the end.

Time Approximately 4-6 Minutes

Scene One: Wedding March plays in the background as **Steve** and **Jennifer** slowly walk out. The underlined portions of the script are to be read from the toilet paper and cross stitched picture.

Jennifer: We would like to thank you all for being here today to celebrate our

50th wedding anniversary with the renewing of our vows.

Steve: What did you say about bowels?

Jennifer: Not bowels, vows!

Steve: (Confused) Oh!

Jennifer: (Elbows Steve) Don't you remember, Steve? We're renewing our vows!

Steve: (Sarcastically) Oh yeah, thanks for joining us on this blessed occasion.

Jennifer: Well, some of you know how naive we were 50 years ago...

Steve: Yeah, that vow-writing thing was her idea...

Jennifer: Anyway, as I was saying, the vows we wrote when we were of the young

and the restless...

Steve: Yeah, and now we're the old and breathless...

Jennifer: (Rolls eyes at **Steve**) The vows we wrote for our wedding day were to say

the least...unrealistic.

Steve: I'll say.

Jennifer: So today, Steve and I, after fifty years, have finally decided not only to

renew our vows...

Steve: We have decided to give our vows a major overhaul.

Jennifer: I have lowered my expectations for Steve.

Steve: And I have lowered my expectations for Jenny.

Jennifer: (Hands him something cross stitched and framed)

Steve: You sewed your vows?

Jennifer: First of all, it is called cross-stitch. Second of all, I framed it so you could

read them every day.



Steve: Just where do you plan on hanging these?

Jennifer: I am going to hang it where you spend most of your day, where you can

read them the most...the bathroom. Well, where are they?

Steve: What?

Jennifer: My vows.

Steve: I don't want to give them to you now.

Jennifer: Would you stop wasting these nice people's time, and hand them over?

Steve: Oh okay, here you go. But it's not because I spend all my time in the

bathroom. (Hands a roll of toilet paper with vows written on the toilet

paper.)

Jennifer: Steve! Why am I not surprised?

Steve: Sorry.

Jennifer: Well let's get on with it. I, Jennifer Lynne Hayes, do solemnly swear to do

the following...solemnly swear...this is not a court case Steve. (Tears one piece of tissue off) I (emphasizing vow) vow not to talk to my

husband while he is watching "Sixty Minutes".
