- What** A man expresses his real and honest thoughts about his belief in God.  
**Themes:** God, Real, Fair, Just, Belief, Disbelief, Faith, Existence, Questions
- Who** Actor (or actress)
- When** Present
- Wear  
(Props)** Stool- optional
- Why** 1 John 5:20; Mark 9:24
- How** This is a very honest piece that should be performed by an experienced actor. This can also be performed by a female, with a few changes.  
*\*NOTE- This is not meant to be a stand-alone script or competition piece. It should be performed with a follow-up message.*
- Time** Approximately 5-7 minutes

*Actor enters and addresses the audience. He can stand or sit on a stool.*

You know, I've never understood it. All across the world, every weekend billions of people gather, in homes, brick buildings, ornate sanctuaries or in large auditoriums for the sole purpose of finding god. You've got Muslims, Hindus, Christians and Jewish people coming together into their own little cliques like clockwork. They wonder what God looks like; where he comes from; what does he want from us... what is he like?

To them, it's not a question. They just grow up mindlessly believing what their parents taught them. Is there a god, you ask them, 'Of course,' they laugh. No need for evidence.
