- What** A confident Christian undergoes a surprise Blessings Audit slowly realizing that many of God's most significant gifts have gone unnoticed, challenging both character and congregation to rethink what they take for granted.
- Themes: Gratitude, Awareness, Humility, Blessings, Perspective
- Who** **David:** Sincere, capable Christian.
Auditor: Calm, perceptive, and quietly authoritative, never accusatory.
Assistant: Efficient, literal, and observant, offers understated humor.
- When** Contemporary
- Costumes** Auditor and Assistant in professional business attire, David in smart casual or business-casual clothing
- Props** Desk, two chairs, clipboard or folder labelled 'Blessings Audit', pen
- Why** James 1:17
- How** The humor is subtle and situational, arising from contrast rather than jokes. The Auditor remains gentle and curious, allowing David to reach each realization himself. The Assistant reinforces the audit framework with quiet physicality and dry observations.
- Time** 5 minutes

Lights up.

The **Auditor** sits at a desk reviewing paperwork. The **Assistant** stands nearby with a clipboard.

There is a knock at the door.

Auditor: Come in.

David enters, confident and relaxed.

David: Hello. David Martin. I'm here for the Blessings Audit at 10 am.

Auditor: Yes. Please take a seat. We've been expecting you.

David sits. The **Assistant** makes a small tick on the clipboard.

Assistant: On time.

David: I like to be organised.

Auditor: That will be useful today. The purpose of this audit is to confirm the blessings you recorded in your Annual Blessings Return.

David: I'm confident it's accurate and complete.

The **Auditor** opens the folder slowly.

Auditor: According to your return, you recorded four blessings this year.

David: That's right.

Assistant: Four blessings noted.

Auditor: A new job, a company car, a family holiday, and your son's graduation.

David: It was a good year.

A brief pause.

Auditor: Is that all?

David: Those were the major ones.

The Auditor stands.

Auditor: Would you mind standing for a moment?

David stands, uncertain.

David: Okay.

Auditor: You're standing.

David: Yes.

Auditor: On your own legs.

The Assistant glances at the clipboard.

Assistant: Two legs. Functional.

David shifts slightly.

Auditor: Many would consider that a blessing.

David reflects.

David: I didn't think to write that down.

Auditor: Please, sit.

David sits.

Auditor: You ate today?

David: Breakfast and lunch.

Assistant: Consistent access to food.

Auditor: You can work, choose, and worship freely?

David nods slowly.

David: I suppose I've been selective.

A longer pause.

Auditor: Would you like to revise your return?

David reaches for the folder.

David: Yes. I think I should.

David writes as he speaks.

David: Health. Family. Provision. Safety. Faith.

He looks up.

David: I could be here all day.

Assistant: That's not unusual.

Auditor: Take your time.

David stands, holding the folder with care.

David: Thank you. I'll bring this back tomorrow.

Auditor: We'll be here.

David exits. The **Auditor** and **Assistant** remain.

Assistant: Most people underestimate.

Auditor: Gratitude grows with awareness.

Lights fade.
