Costumes Sound effects- growling stomach and nose blowing.

PropsQuestion of the Day Sign- Are you obeying the Ten Commandments?

Why Exodus 20:1-17

How The characters are siblings and their voices/personalities should be practiced as

follows:

Stevie- the oldest and a little uptight Petey- extremely intelligent and kind

Mimi- sweet and helpful

Ralph- the youngest, cute and funny

Practice having the puppets say certain words simultaneously for effect (i.e. "We're the McCreadys" and "Amen" etc.).

For ease of performance, having 2 persons per puppet works very well. One sits directly behind the other. The front puppeteer actually works the puppet, and the 2nd puppeteer does the voice, touching the front puppeteer on the shoulder when he has a line.

Ask middle school or older puppeteers to do the actual performance for the younger class. The middle schoolers will learn the lesson too.

Time Approximately 14 minutes

SCRIPT REMOVE WATERMARK SKITGUYS.COM Stevie appears and cheerfully greets the audience.

Stevie: Hi boys and girls! Let me introduce myself! I'm Stevie McCready...

Petey: (appears) And I'm Petey McCready!

Mimi: (appears) And I'm Mimi McCready!

Ralph: (appears) And I'm Ralph!

All: We're the McCready's!

Stevie: And we've got a wonderful lesson for you today, don't we Petey?

Petey: Indeed, we do! What are we talking about today, Mimi?

Mimi: Well, Petey, we're gonna talk about the Ten Commandments.

Ralph: Can I name the first one? Please? Can I? Can I?

Mimi: Okay Ralphie, go ahead!

Ralph: Thou shalt clean thy room!

Petey: No, I'm afraid that is incorrect Ralph...

Ralph: Oh! I know! I know! Thou shalt eat thy vegetables!

Petey: No Ralph, again, incorrect.

Ralph: Do your homework?

Petey: No...

Ralph: Wash behind my ears?

Mimi: Ralphie, I believe you're referring to the rules we have at our home,

aren't you, dearie?

Ralph: Well yeah, and, if I don't do them, Mama says there will be con...con

se... consequences! I'm not sure what means exactly, but it don't sound

good!

Mimi: "Doesn't". And Ralphie, that just means there will be some kind of

punishment if you don't obey Mama's rules!

Ralph: | I knew it! (swings his arm)

Mimi: What we're talking about today is the commandments that *God* wants

us to live by!

Ralph: (with revelation) Oh...yeah! Hey, can I be excused?

Stevie: But Ralph, we're in the middle of a show!

Ralph: Please? I need to get something and I promise it won't take long! Please

please please please please....

Petey: This is highly unusual! What do you think Mimi?

Mimi: Well, (to Ralph) if you promise you'll hurry back?

Ralph: (confidently) Won't even know I'm gone! (Ralph leaves)

Stevie: (soberly, leans toward the audience) Somehow, I find that very hard to

believe.

Petey: Mimi, can you give us a little background on the Ten Commandments

please?

Mimi: I'd be happy to! The Ten Commandments were given to Moses by God

on Mount Sinai. These were commands that God wanted everyone to

live by, and it's important to know what they are!

Petey: Stevie, can you please read the 1st Commandment for us?

Stevie: Sure can! Love God more than you love anything or anyone.

Mimi: This means that God should come first in everything we do. Not

anything or anybody should be more important in our lives than God!

Petey: Wonderful explanation, Mimi! Now, on to the 2nd Commandment.

Ralph: (suddenly appears, breathless) Petey! Wait!

Petey: You're back! Good! We just covered the 1st Commandment!

Ralph: Petey, can I read *my* own writings of the Ten Commandments?

Stevie: (amazed) You have your own writings of the Ten Commandments?

Ralph: Sure do! We were learning them in Sunday school, so I made out my

own list to help me remember!

Petey: Well now, that *is* impressive! What did you write for the 1st

commandment?

Ralph: (clears his throat) Number one: Keep God first in all you do, and make

sure you obey this rule!

Mimi: (giggles) Very good, Ralphie!

Petey: Well now, that sums it up properly I believe! What do you have written

for the 2nd commandment?

Ralph: Number two: Worship our God in heaven alone, no earthly idol's on the

throne!

Petey: Very good Ralph! We only worship God in heaven, and nothing else! No

idol worship!

Ralph: Right! (unsure) Uh...Petey?

Petey: Yes Ralph?

Ralph: What's an idol?

Petey: Oh well, an idol would be anything or anyone that you worship or put

more importance on than God in heaven.

Stevie: Wow. You know something, Petey, if we love God above anything else,

then we will worship only Him!

Petey: Excellent observation Stevie! The first two commandments fit nicely

together, don't they?

Mimi: They really do!

Stevie: What did you write for the 3rd commandment, Ralph?

Ralph: Number three: Holy is God's precious name. Never speak His name in

vain!

Mimi: That's right! Gods' name is precious and should never be spoken

carelessly.

Petey: So, the first three commandments are all referring to God and how we

should love Him above all else...

Ralph: Above all else...

Petey: Worship *only* our God in heaven...

Ralph: Worship *only* our God in heaven....

Petey: And *always* show respect to His holy name!

Ralph: Respect His holy name! Got it!

Mimi: Ralphie, I like how you made the commandments rhyme to make them

easy to remember!

Ralph: (embarrassed, looking down, moving his head back and forth)

Aww...go on Mimi...

Stevie: Hey Ralph, what do you have for the 4th Commandment?

Ralph: Number four: The Sabbath day was made for rest, so do *no work* and

be... your...best!

Mimi: That's right! God created the universe in six days and then rested on the

Sabbath. We should rest on the Sabbath day too!

Petey: I like that, Ralph! When we obey God's commandments, we are doing

our best!

Mimi: Anytime we're obeying the Lords' commandments, we're doing our

best!

Stevie: Now, Ralph, onto the 5th Commandment!

Ralph: Number five: Your mommy and daddy gave you life. Honor them both

with all your might!

Stevie: You know something, if it wasn't for our parents, we wouldn't even be

here now, would we?

Mimi: That's right, Stevie!

Petey: Now, I want to go back to something that Ralph brought up previously,

when he spoke of our mother's house rules. By *obeying* mother's rules, we are honoring this 5th commandment given by God because...we are

honoring our mother!

Stevie: I see what you mean! We love God, so we obey the 5th commandment

to honor our parents, and then by obeying our parents and their rules,

we are honoring the 5th commandment and obeying God!

Ralph: (dreamily, looking up) You know something...it's like the circle of life!

Mimi: (giggles)

Stevie: (laughing) Good one, Ralph! Now read the 6th Commandment please!

Ralph: Number six: Don't let your hatred hide within; to kill someone is a

deadly sin!

Mimi: Thank you, Ralph! God wants us to love one another. Every life is

precious. Taking someone else's life is a very serious offense to our God.

Stevie: How true! And many times, a terrible act can start with hate. The first

murder recorded in the bible is in the book of Genesis when Cain

murdered his brother Abel.

Ralph: (in disbelief) You mean...he killed his own brother?

Petey: Yes, Ralph, he did! And he did it because he was jealous. Jealousy can

very easily turn to hatred. If we ever feel these feelings of jealousy or hate, we need to quickly turn it all over to God and ask for His help.

Ralph hangs his head low.

Mimi: Ralphie dear, what's the matter?

Ralph: (emotionally and loud, eyes to the ceiling) I just wanna say...I would

never hurt my brothers! I...I love all my brothers! (to Mimi) And...and I

love you too, Mimi!

Mimi: Aww, I love you too, Ralphie! (hugs Ralph)

Petey: (emotionally) And I love all my brothers! And you too Mimi!

Ralph and Mimi and Petey hug and tell one another that they love each other.

Silence as Ralph, Mimi & Petey stop to look at Stevie.

Stevie: (very emotionally, eyes to the ceiling) I just love...(crying) EVE–RY–BO-

DY!

All four puppets hug and tell one another that they love each other, then separate, wiping their eyes.

Petey: Well now, there's nothing like an emotional outburst on

occasion...but...I guess we had better get back to our lesson! Now Ralph, dearest brother, will you please read the 7th Commandment?

Ralph: (affectionately) Anything for you, Petey! (wiping his eyes) Number

seven: Love your husband and love your wife. Stay faithful to them all

your life!

Mimi: Thank you, Ralphie! Staying faithful in marriage means to never give

your affections to someone other than your spouse. Once a man and woman have spoken marriage vows, they should be committed to each

other for the rest of their lives.

Petey: Now, Ralph, are you ready to read the 8th commandment?

Ralph: Number eight: Stealing stuff is just not cool, so never, never break this

rule!

Very good Ralphie! Now this is very simple to understand. Never, never, Mimi:

NEVER take something that doesn't belong to you.

Right, Mimi! If it doesn't belong to you, then it's hands off! What's next, Petey:

Stevie?

Number nine: You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor. Stevie:

(looking around) And who is our neighbor? Mimi:

Mimi, you know our neighbor is our sweet little 'ole cousin, Edie Ralph:

McCready!

That's right...and boy does she ever make the best biscuits and gravy! Stevie:

Melt in your mouth good! Mmmm! Wish I had one right now!

(covers his mouth) Oops! Ralph:

What is it, Ralphie? Mimi:

Ralph: (suspiciously) Uhhhh...nothin'!

Mimi: Well, Ralphie, biblically speaking, everyone you meet is your neighbor.

> False testimony is saying something that isn't true, or to put it simply, telling a lie. So, we should never tell a lie about anyone or anything.

Ralphie, what did you write for the 9th commandment?

(slowly and sadly) Number nine: Be...be tru...truthful in the words you Ralph:

say, and do this every... single...day...

Very cute Ralphie! Good job! Mimi:

l agree! We should always, always, ALWAYS tell the truth! Now Stevie, will Petey:

you please read the 10th commandment?

Stevie: You shall not covet your neighbor's house, or your neighbor's wife, or his

servant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.

Mimi: Thank you, Stevie! To covet means to want for yourself the things that

belongs to another person. This is *not* pleasing to God.

Ralph: (crying) Ohhhh!

Mimi: Ralphie, what's the matter, dearie?

Does...does that include 'You shall not covet your neighbor's biscuit Ralph:

and...and...gravy? I'm sorry! I'm sorry! I'm SO sssooorrryyyy!

Ralphie dear! Whatever are you talking about? Mimi:

Ralph: (staring at the ceiling) I've broken so many commandments, I can't

count them all! (crying loudly)

Petey: This is very concerning indeed!

Stevie: You shall not covet your neighbor's biscuit and gravy? Huh? What is he

talking about?

Mimi: Ralphie, calm down, dear. *(patting his shoulder)* Now tell us what this is

all about...

Ralph: Well...you know...cousin Edie McCready sent over biscuits and gravy

this morning...for...for the whole family...

Mimi: (nodding in agreement to **Petey**) Yes, and it was delicious...

Petey: Truly delectable....

Stevie: I didn't get a biscuit...there wasn't enough for everybody.

Ralph: That's it! That's it!

Mimi: What's it, dearie?

Ralph: Well...after I ate my biscuit, I was still a little hungry and...and Stevie's

biscuit was just lying there...so...so... (crying loudly, eyes to the ceiling)

I ATE STEVIE'S BISCUIT AND GRAAAAVVVVVY!

Mimi: (soberly) Oh...I see.

Petey: Truly unfortunate...

Stevie: You did... WHAT?

Ralph: (to **Mimi**) That's bad, right?

Mimi: Yes, Ralphie, that was *bad!*

Stevie: (with revelation) So you ate my biscuit and gravy?

Ralph: I'm sorry, Stevie! I lied! I broke the 9th commandment! (crying) I'm a no-

good lying...so and so!

Stevie: (looking down, loud GROWLING NOISE)

Petey: (irritated) Whatever is that disturbing sound?

Stevie: Oh! That's just my (irritated, looking at Ralph) EMPTY STOMACH

GROWLING!

Ralph: Oh! (crying uncontrollably)

Mimi: Now Ralphie dear, that's quite enough! No need to make yourself sick!

Ralph: But...I broke the 1st commandment by not putting God first, because...

God wouldn't have wanted me to take Stevie's biscuit...

Petey: True enough...

Ralph: ...and I broke the 8th commandment because I took Stevie's

biscuit...when it didn't belong to me...

Petey: ...and the gravy...

Ralph: (crying uncontrollably) And the gggrrraaaavvvyyy!

Mimi: (scolding) Petey!

Petey: (to **Mimi**, factually) Well...you know it's just not as good without the

gravy...Still! That's not an excuse!

Ralph: And... (blows his nose) I broke the 9th commandment when I lied to

Stevie...I...I told him Cousin Edie didn't send over enough biscuits...I

bore false witness!

Mimi: My goodness, Ralphie!

Ralph: And I broke the 10th commandment because...I was longing for

something that wasn't even mine!

Petey: (troubled) Oh when will all these deceptions end?

Ralph: (crying loudly)

Mimi: Ralphie, the whole reason for the Ten Commandments is to show us that

there are absolutes. Some things are absolutely right, and some things are absolutely wrong. And, by studying these commandments, you have realized some things you have done wrong, but now that you know this,

you can repent, say you're sorry, and behave better in the future.

Petey: Mimi is absolutely correct. We *all* make mistakes. What is important is to

recognize when we do. Ask the Lord to forgive you, and then ask Stevie

to forgive you too.

Ralph: Really? Okay. Stevie, (sniff, sniff) I'm sorry I lied to you about your biscuit.

Do you forgive me?

Stevie: Well, I can see you're really sorry. (very decisively) Yes Ralph, I forgive

you!

Ralph: Thank you Stevie! (bows his head) Dear Lord, I broke 4 commandments

today, I didn't put You first in this situation, I coveted, I stole, and then I lied, and ...I'm so sorry. Please forgive me. And I pray for your strength to

help me in the future. Thank you, Jesus. Amen.

Ralph: (to Mimi) That's good, right?

Mimi: Yes Ralphie, that was good!

Petey: Wait a minute, we haven't heard Ralph's writing for the 10th

commandment. Go ahead and read it to us Ralph!

Ralph: Oh...okay. Number ten: Be happy with the things you have, to wish for

someone's biscuit...I mean...stuff... is bad!

Mimi: (giggles)

Petey: I am thankful for God's word and the Ten Commandments because it

shows me what God expects of me as a follower of Jesus. It's good to commit these commandments to memory to help us make right

decisions!

Mimi: Right Petey! God's word is precious!

Petey: That's right! Let's give Him praise!

Ralph: (enthusiastically) We serve an awesome God!

Stevie: You can say that again!

Ralph: (loudly) We serve an awesome God!

Petey: Most assuredly!

Mimi: Praise the name of Jesus!

All: Amen!

Stevie: Okay everybody, remember, the Ten Commandments can be found in

the book of Exodus chapter 20 and verses 1 through 17!

Hold up Question of the Day sign.

Petey: Here is the question of the day. Are you obeying the Ten

Commandments?

Ralph: Let God have *His* way, and it will be one of the best things you can ever

do!

Stevie: Well... this is Stevie!

Petey: ...and this is Petey!

Mimi: ...and this is Mimi!

Ralph: ...and this is Ralph!

All: We're the McCready's!

All: See you next time! Good-bye everybody! Good-bye!
