- What** There are many evangelism techniques available to us, but which one is best? This script demonstrates a few. **Themes:** Evangelism, Witness, Sharing, Outreach, Christians, Church
- Who** The Strategist The Bannerman
 The Amplified George
 Interviewer Jorge
 The Liar
- When** Present
- Wear
(Props)** Book that says "Evangelism 101" on the cover
 Christian t-shirt
 Witness glove (can be found at a Christian bookstore)
 WWJD bracelet
 "Money" tract (tract that looks like a dollar bill) plus 4 more tracts
 Small tin of mints
- Why** Matthew 28:18-20
- How** Each character should be very distinct. Costuming can help out with this a lot. Keep the dialogue moving and transitions smooth.
 *NOTE: The end of this script is Tommy Woodard and Eddie James' personal testimony about Eddie's salvation experience. Use this opportunity to use a personal story from someone on your team.
- Time** Approximately 4-5 minutes

Each actor should remain still until it is their time to speak. If your blocking requires each actor to enter when it's their time to speak, be sure to practice the transitions so there is no down time.

The Strategist: Evangelism is not for the weak. I should know. I wrote a whole book about it (*shows book*). Self-published. Most Christians are just good for bake sales and potluck dinners. But I'm telling you this right now: It takes a lot of moxie to grab a non-believer by the shirt collar and throw them in the front door of a church and say, 'Try living out your heathen life in front of a Holy God that way.' It's like holy water on a vampire. That's divine intervention, my friend.

The Amplified: Repent because the kingdom of the Lord is neigh. Come to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Interviewer: Well Sir, it sounds like you are very passionate about Jesus.

The Amplified: I am...

Interviewer: Umm...

The Amplified: ...and you should also be...

Interviewer: Okay...

The Amplified: ...passionate about the lord.

Interviewer: Sir if there's...

The Amplified: You need to get sanctified or chicken fried.

Interviewer: Can we...?

The Amplified: You need to get with the Lord or (*beat*) drive a ford?

Interviewer: Sir...we...

The Amplified: Get right or get left.

The Liar: I share my faith. Ok. That's a lie. People don't even know I'm a Christian. I want to though. Again. Another lie. I hardly share much less have the will to do anything else.

Hmm. Ok. If there was pizza and ice cream every time there was faith-sharing, I would do it. That's a lie. I'm lactose intolerant. Again, another lie. I'm just too cheap to buy dairy.

The Strategist: Tip #95: Use big church words like transubstantiation. Heathens get confused easily and the more confused they are, the more shamed they are. And the more shamed they are, the more apt they are to make a decision to Jesus Christ.
