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What: So many women compare themselves to someone else. This sketch shows how comparison is a bottomless pit. Something God never intended. (Themes: Comparison, Worth in Christ)

Who: Liz Amy

When: Present day

Why: Galatians 5-6

Wear (Props): Modern day clothing

How: The whole time the actors face out toward the audience. On the very last line it can be effective having the actors turn and look at each other as they say the final words of the script.

Time: Approximately 4-6 minutes



*The skit starts with **Liz** and **Ann** standing on opposite ends of the stage. They speak directly to the audience, but do not see each other.*

Both: Wow, what a night!

Ann: That was the most incredible party I’ve ever been to!

Liz: I’ve never seen so many people! There was Ron, Ann, David, Steve, Katie...

Ann: That geeky guy, with the sweaty armpits...

Liz: And (*Smiling, whimsical*) Jeff Kingston!

Both: Ooohh! Jeff Kingston! (*Both show how fond they are of this man-bunk*)

Ann: I can’t believe he came and talked to me.

Liz: I will never forget what he said.

Both: He came by me and said, “Hey.” (*Both do their “Jeff” impersonation*)

Liz: What a night.

Ann: One I will never forget.

Both: But still... I wonder if people liked me. I mean, really like me. Did I make a good impression?

Liz: Ann sure made an impression on the guys tonight. She’s always so funny. Always making the guys laugh. She’s so attentive: remembering different things about people, clearing plates, and



staying late to help clean up... Such a leader,
such a servant.

Ann: As usual, Liz was a hit at the party. She’s got that quiet nature, simple beauty, and she’s so easy to talk to. She always knows just what to say and do. People always say such great things about her. She can just be herself... so real, no masks.

Both: She sure has got it made. She’s so...

Liz: ... carefree.

Ann: ... responsible.

Both: ... and pretty. And then there’s me.

Liz: I wear this make-up just to hide my face. If people really saw what was behind all this, they would see how ugly I am.

Ann: Look at this face! I mean, you could play connect the dots on it.

Liz: Well, I guess I should be thankful for all this make-up. What the public doesn’t know won’t hurt them.

Ann: Lord, isn’t there enough ugliness in the world without my face needing to make a contribution?
