- What** Who knew a giant, talking turkey could have so much wisdom? Take a look at this humorous illustration of what happens when we say the words but miss the actual meaning of Thanksgiving. **Themes:** Thanksgiving, Gratitude, Gratefulness
- Who** Laura
Drew
Turkey
- When** Thanksgiving; Present
- Wear (Props)** Turkey Costume
- Why** 1 Thessalonians 5:18
- How** Dialogue will move like a ping pong ball.
- Time** Approximately 1-2 minutes

Laura and Drew are onstage, facing away from each other. Turkey is dressed in a turkey costume with a removable turkey head, squatting down between them or waiting offstage.

Laura: Hey! Happy Thanksgiving!

Drew: Happy Thanksgiving to you, too.

Laura: So, since it's Thanksgiving and all, I should probably say "thanks."
So...thanks.

Drew: Well, thank you.

Laura: *(Smugly)* Just remember who said it first!

Drew: Oh yeah? Well, remember who said it loudest. *(Speaking a little louder)*
Thank you!

Laura: *(Taking the challenge)* Oh? I can say it louder than that! *(Cupping her hands around her mouth and yelling)* Thank YOU!!

Drew: Oh please, that's nothing! *(Not to be outdone, gets right in her face and yells)* Thank you! Thank you! Thank you!

Laura: *(Back in his face, smugly)* Okay, I can say it loud and in Spanish. *(Cups her hands, yelling)* Gracias!

Turkey pops up between them or enters from stage left and walks to center stage, stopping in the middle of them.

Turkey: Heeeyyyy! What is wrong with you guys? *(Taking off the turkey head)*
Thanksgiving is not about outdoing each other. There's a difference between saying "thanks" and being thankful. Don't just say the words...live them.

Drew: Thank YOU.
