How This is a short monologue that is perfect to set up a sermon or to use as an

opener into a song during worship. You may add some "givers" that might be dressed in bad sweaters to walk by and put money in the donations bucket

before the actor begins his/her monologue.

Time Approximately 1-2 minutes

A man/woman is standing next to a box or jar filled with money. He/She is ringing a bell and presumably interacting with unseen shoppers.
