“A Virtual Easter Invite”

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- What** Two friends talk about inviting someone to church for Easter, but one is slow to realize that inviting someone to virtual church just isn't quite the same.
Themes: Easter, Invite, Neighbor, Evangelism, Friends
- Who** Actor 1
Actor 2
- When** Present
- Wear (Props)** Both actors are dressed casually
Café table
2 Café chairs
2 Coffee cups
Fake or old iPhone® you won't mind breaking
- Why** Matthew 25:40; Luke 10:27
- How** They can be both male, both female or one M and one F. You decide! Go crazy! Have fun with this short skit to help humor break down walls for the congregation to start thinking about who they could take a risk on and ask to Easter services. Depending on what your stage is like, have them sitting down at a coffee shop, standing in line, or just facing the audience and having a conversation.
- Time** Approximately 4-6 minutes

Actor 1 and Actor 2 are on stage sitting at a café table as if they are in a coffee shop.

Actor 1: So, who you inviting to Easter?

Actor 2: I'm not.

Actor 1: What do you mean?

Actor 2: That's what I mean- "I'm not". There is no other way to explain that.

Actor 1: I don't understand why you didn't even give it some thought or a list of church answers of excuses of why it won't be happening.

Actor 2: Look, it's the 2000's. Inviting someone to church is so...80's. We have just held onto this "tradition" for a really long time. If I invite someone to church I might as well be saying I like Bill Cosby sweaters... (*beat*) and I really don't.

Actor 1: I see.

Actor 2: Plus, we really don't need to.

Actor 1: What do you mean?

Actor 2: All you have to do is tell a friend, neighbor or loved one to watch the service we do at this church on TV. That way it's less intrusive.

Actor 1: Our service isn't televised on TV.

Actor 2: You sure? Cause I could have sworn I saw Pastor _____ (*your pastor's name*) on television.

Actor 1: I think your thinking of _____ (*famous actor or actress*).

NOTE: You can make this a great compliment or a funny thing depending on style of church and preference from pastor. If it's like "Brad Pitt", it would be great to kind of do the "wink, wink, nudge, nudge" type of thing and have the other actor say, "you can say that but it still doesn't keep you from tithing". As an off-shoot ad-lib type line to have the crowd laugh with the actors as if they are making it up on the spot.)

Actor 2: Yeah, I guess so- they do look a lot alike. Maybe that was it.

Actor 1: Probably was.

Actor 2: Hey, you can still have them listen to the webisode of the service from their own home.

Actor 1: Webisodes? What are you talking about? We don't have webisodes.

Actor 2: Really?! This is 2012 right? Are we still using outhouses too? What about a podcast? Do we have a podcast we can just invite them to listen to?

Actor 1: *(Option A)* We do but who really listens to it. *(Or option B)* Nope not that either.

Actor 2: So I guess that probably means no 3D?

Actor 1: No 3D.

Actor 2: And no holograms?

Actor 1: Nope.

Actor 2: You're sure that there's no holograms?

ENDING:

Actor 1: *(Slowly walking offstage)* Yep, this is the Easter we are going to invite some people that need to hear the "Good News" and we are going to be glad we did it. We're going to be the light on a hill.

Actor 2: Oh I get it. And the light on the hill could be like the glow of our iPads® or iPhones®, right? This is all making more sense now.

Actor 1: No. The light on the hill is Christ. It's Christ's light. The light of his Good News.

Actor 2: Wait, so Jesus is holding the iPad® or iPhone®? That's weird. They didn't have iPads® or iPhones® back then.

Actor 1: No, buddy.

Actor 2: Oh, I get it. Silly me. It's an iPad® or iPhone® with a picture of Jesus ON it.

Actor 1: I can tell we have some work to do.

Lights Fade. The end.
