**How** This is a very casual conversation and the husband and wife characters should

be comfortable with one another. Keep the pacing up, but don't rush through

your lines.

**Time** Approximately 7-9 minutes

**Husband** is sitting on the couch watching TV. **Wife** enters with a box of Christmas lights.

Wife: Okay, here's the Christmas lights. Let's get to it!

Husband: Let's?

Wife: Yes. And by "let's" I mean you. These lights aren't going to hang

themselves. I've been asking you ever since Thanksgiving and now it's

literally days before Christmas.

**Husband:** I will, I just have a lot of stuff I need to do and then I'll do that.

Wife: Like what?

Husband: Well, I've got a lot of shows in my "now playing" list on my TiVo and if I

don't watch them then they're not going to watch themselves.

Wife: What is going on?

Husband: Well, that's just it, I don't know what's going on. I have to watch these

shows on my "now playing" list so I can find out. It's a very slippery

slope.

Wife: No, that's not what I mean. With you...what's going on with you? Now

that I think about it, you haven't been you for a while now.

**Husband:** Alright, you know what, I'll just go hang the lights. (He gets up to leave.)

**Wife:** No, no, sit down. I have been married to you long enough to know when

something's up...and something's up.

**Husband:** You really want to know?

Wife: I really do.

**Husband:** Okay, I'll tell you. I don't know if this year I'm in to the whole Christmas

**Wife:** Christmas thingy?

**ENDING:** 

Wife:
