- Themes: Communication, Relationships, Dating, Teens
- Who** Brian
Amy- smart/nerdy
Stacy- cheerleader
Jenny
- When** Present
- Wear
(Props)** Actors should wear clothes appropriate for their characters.
- Why** Matthew 5:37
- How** Have fun with these characters. Amy and Stacy should be a little more over the top. Keep the pacing up and the dialogue energetic, being careful not to let it drag.
- Time** Approximately 3 minutes

Three girls enter, chattering. **Amy** is a brainy nerd, **Stacy** is a sarcastic cheerleader, **Jenny** is fairly normal. **Brian** enters opposite.

Stacy: Why don't we, like, let him decide? There he is now.

Amy: Brian! We were just confabulating about you.

Jenny: Hey Brian! We were just talking about you.

Amy: That's what I said!

Brian: Nothing bad, I hope.

Jenny: Oh no, of course not.

Stacy: Fess up, which of us do you want to go out with? (*cheerleader like*) Give me a... Stacy!

Brian: What?

Jenny: Stacy and Amy and I were debating over which one of us you would choose to go out with.

Brian: That's very direct.

Jenny: It's a short skit.

Brian: What?

Jenny: Nothing.

Stacy: Besides, I have dibs.

Jenny: Hold on, why do you get dibs?

Stacy: I called it. That's what dibs is!

Brian: I really don't know any of you. You're kind of putting me on the spot.

Amy: How about this, I saw this really old game show on YouTube where a girl would ask interrogatives to a trifecta of bachelors, causing her to become proficient in her understanding of them. We could do that here.
